## NCCU Eagles Blank Winston-Salem Rams 21-0

WINSTON-SALEM — The Carolina Central Eagles jumped back into the CIAA Southern Division race with a convincing 21-0 blanking of Winston-Salem Saturday at Bowman Gray Stadium.

The Eagles' record to 2-1 in the CIAA and the Rams fell to 0-1 overall. Only did the Eagle Rams for the straight year, but buried all Rams with a swarming offense that limited the Rams to 72 yards rushing and 79 yards passing. Last week at N. C. A&T, the Rams threw for 258 yards and three touchdowns. They turned the ball over on downs at the nine, lost a fumble at the 18 and missed a 34-yard field goal with three seconds left in the half.
