

Cross Country Hornets Take City-County Meet

Hillside Hornet boys cross country team finished first in Durham's annual city-county high school meet.
 The Hornets rolled up 52 points at the end of the 5000 meters distance run. Durham High finished second with 59 points.
 Durham's School of Science and Math placed third with 67 followed by Jordan High with 96.
 Durham Academy was fifth with 113, Southern High was sixth with 139 and Northern Knights finished last at 146.
 The Hornet victory increases their overall standing to 9-1. The Hornets are 2-1 in Big Six Conference meets.
 The boys top ten finishers are: Paul Maxwell, Durham Academy-16:30; Dwight Bostic, Hillside-16:34; Tony Villines, Durham High-16:43; Musc Williams, Hillside-16:46; B. French, Durham High-16:58; Mike Williams, Durham High-17:11; Chris Bennett, Northern-17:23; B. Watkins, Science and Math-17:41; D. Murphy, Science and Math-17:37; Calvin Calkins, Jordan-17:38.

Four other Hornets out of the 42 boys who started the 3.1 mile course placed. They are Tracy McAllister, thirteenth; Everett Dean, fourteenth; John Hunter, nineteenth; and Rod Wilson finished twenty-eighth.
 In girls action, Betsy Wilkins of Durham Academy placed first at 20:31, followed by Dianne Zito, Northern Knights-21:06; Meredith Wingaard, Jordan High-21:50; Alita Brown, Hillside-22:05; Angela Graham, Hillside-22:59; and Beth Wilson, Hillside-23:22.
 Coach Blunt's Hornets are preparing for the October 23rd sectional meet at Duke University, and they should perform well in State prep cross country competition at Charlotte's McAlpine Park on October 30.

Basketball Deflector

Ever want to practice basketball by yourself but get tired of chasing balls? Well, a Durham inventor believes he has developed a patentable system for returning a basketball to its player. The device, called a "Basketball Deflector", is specifically designed for use in set shots (from one particular area) or for free throws.

James Devone of Durham hopes to develop a major market for his system. The mechanism is designed to receive the ball as it drops through the net and return it to the player where the shot originated, thus eliminating the need for additional participants in the play or the need to snag the ball after each shot. Ms. Cathy Taylor displays the device which, along with several other inventions Devone has developed in the last six years, is expected to be marketed or franchised through Devone Manufacturing Co., Inc. back David Riley was tagged with an interference penalty at the 23. They scored on a 20 yard Ken Tinsley to Steve Gilliam pass play. Fraylon marched the Eagles 72 yards in seven plays and set up the fourth NCCU touchdown with a 22 yard run. Junior fullback Bennie Tate plunged the final yard giving the Eagles a 27-7 lead with 1:13 left in the first period.
 Linebacker Myron Dupree gave the Eagles the ball at the PSU 38 when he picked off a Tinsley pass. The Eagles became mere mortals on this series and loss the ball on downs at the 22. Fayetteville went to the Eagles 35 again aided by a fourth down penalty in a punting situation.
 Central added seven more points when the Eagles marched the 65 yards in 10 plays. Fraylon scored his third td on a five yard scamper around left end. NCCU led at halftime 34-7.
 Reserve quarterback Greg Grayson marched the Eagles 85 yards midway the third period tossing a 5 yard pass to Bennie Tate for the score.
 A blocked punt set up the Broncos only score of 3 yards by Marty Blue with 7:59 left in the game.

"We're our worst enemy when we face an opponent," said Central coach Henry Lattimore. "Every time I look up there's a penalty."
 The Eagles destroyed the Broncos limiting them to 16 yards rushing and only 46 yards through the air. Senior All-American linebacker candidate Chris McKinstry noted, "Our job is to completely shut down the offense so that our offense gets more time to do its thing. We now feel that if we get them the ball in good field position, they'll score."
 Lattimore retorted, "We know that the defense will be consistent and perform well. We are especially pleased of our blocking and offensive performance."
 He added, "We are going to have to do a better job of protection on our tight punt formation."
 The Eagles rushed for 179 yards and passed for 153 more.

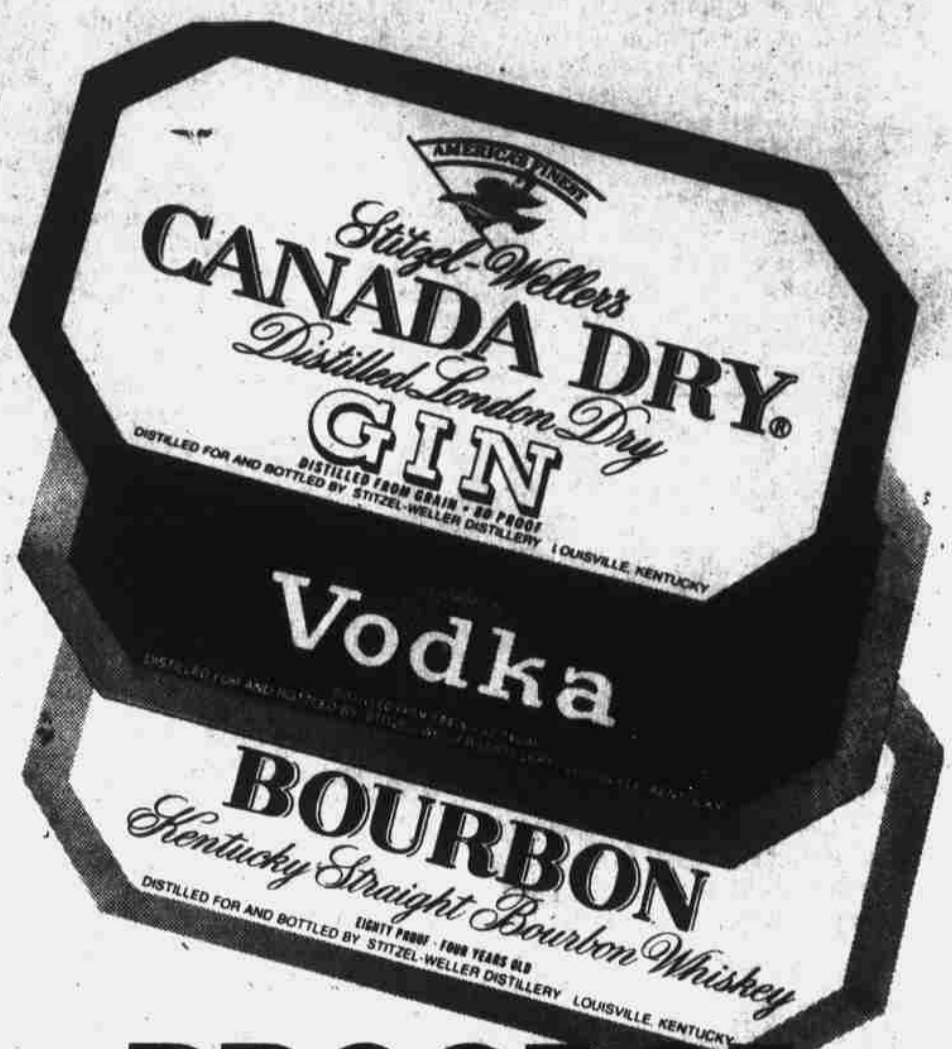
