Energy Program To Begin

Families who need assistance with paying their heating bills this winter can apply to the Durham County Department of Social Services beginning October 19.

An estimated 300,000 low income households across the state will be eligible for financial help with their heating bills this winter through the federal Low-Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP) and approximately 5,000 of these will be from Durham County. According to Dan Hudgins, Durham County Director of Social Services, the program provides a one-time payment to help eligible households pay their heating bills. However, it is not the purpose of the program to pay all of the household's heating bills, but to provide some relief from the high energy cost of energy. The amount of payment a household receives will depend on the number of people in the household, their income, the region of the state where they live and the type of fuel used.

To be eligible, households must have a total countable income at or below the non-farm poverty level and assets valued at \$2,200 or less.

Unlike last year when households who were receiving Supplemental Security Income, food stamps or Aid to Families with Dependent Children did not have to apply, all households will be required to apply this year for the LIEAP.

According to Hudgins, applications will continue through December 11, 1981. Hudgins emphasizes that this is not a first come, first served program. Everyone who applies during the October 19 through December 11 period and is found eligible will receive a check although checks will not be mailed until early February.
