

Aggies Bow To Mississippi Valley

GREENSBORO — North Carolina A&T State lost a non-conference game to Mississippi Valley on the

Aggie's Homecoming before 20,000 spectators here Saturday. Following the opening kickoff, A&T scored on their second play from

scrimmage when runningback Waymon Pitts dashed 59 yards for a touchdown. Aaron Herring added the conversion, giving the Aggies a

quick 7-0 lead. Mississippi Valley, two series later, scored their first touchdown on a two-yard run by Ricky Carson. Valley's PAT

evened the score at 7-7 with 7:38 remaining in the first period. Neither the Aggies nor Delta Devils managed to score in the second period.
