United Nations 36th Anniversary

The Baha'i Community of Durham will join people around the world in marking the 36th Anniversary of the founding of the United Nations. On U. N. Day, Saturday, October 24 at 3 p.m., the Durham Baha'is and interested persons will meet at 2522 Elgin St. Jack Forbes, President, United Nations Association of Chapel Hill, will speak on the *Goals of the U. N.* Miss Sally Jamir will speak on the *Role of the Baha'i International Community at the U. N.*

United Nations Day was established to foster our awareness of the interdependence of the world's many nations and of the pressing need to seek global solutions to the unprecedented and complex problems that face mankind at this time—human rights, population growth, environmental quality, food distribution, energy production, nuclear proliferation, and the maintenance of peace. Each year, Baha'i communities across America join their fellow citizens in marking this day by sponsoring special events in their own communities.

Since its beginning in 1844, the Baha'i Faith has supported every effort to unify the nations of the world, including the League of Nations and the United Nations. Baha'u'llah, the Prophet-Founder of the Baha'i Faith whose name means, "The Glory of God," has made the need for a world commonwealth a cornerstone of His teachings. In His numerous Writings, He characterizes this new era in humankind's continuous spiritual evolution as the Dispensation of Unity, the age in which the human family will achieve its maturity through the establishment of a world civilization and the unification of the diverse peoples of the human race. Baha'u'llah has said, "So powerful is the light of unity that it can illuminate the whole world." In another place, He has written, "That which the Lord hath ordained as the overruling remedy and nightiest instrument for the healing of all the world is the union of all its people in one, universal Cause, one common Faith."

The Baha'i Faith currently holds "consultative status" with the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations, with UNICEF, and with several other committees of the U.N. The Baha'i International Community maintains an office at both the United Nations and its regional offices, and Baha'i representatives are sent to many international conferences and gatherings that address themselves to the complex problems facing mankind. The Baha'i Faith is an independent, world religion with adherents in more than 330 countries and territories of the world. Its sacred Writings have been translated into over 660 languages and dialects. The World Centre of the Baha'i Faith, with its Holy Shrines, is located in the Holy Land.
