

New Bishop for UC of C

MEMPHIS, TENN. — Right Reverend Frederick Douglas Macklin of Munford, Tenn., is the new bishop of the Church of God in Christ. Bishop Macklin will preside over eight-six congregations and missions in the city limits of Memphis and will continue to serve as pastor of Homeland Church of God in Christ, 1490 Briton Street, in the Hyde Park Section.

The son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Robert Macklin, he was born in Tipton County, Tennessee on February 14, 1914. He was educated in the Tipton County Public School System and received Theological training at Washington Bible College, Washington, D. C. Right Reverend Macklin was ordained by the late Bishop A. B. McEwen of Memphis in July 1940 at the Twenty-Third Session of the Annual Holy Convocation for the State of Tennessee and began his pastoral ministry in the same year.

He succeeds the Most Reverend J. O. Patterson, Presiding Bishop of the Church of God in Christ, Inc., who served the Headquarters Jurisdiction as Prelate for more than 12 years. Bishop Macklin had served as Administrative Assistant to the Presiding Bishop and Chairman of the Bishop's Jurisdictional Board.

Bishop Macklin is the sixth Jurisdictional Bishop in the history of the Church of God in Christ in the state of Tennessee and fourth to preside over the Headquarters City of Memphis.
