Carson Goes For Gain

Sophomore fullback Reece Carson hits the hole against Bowie State. Carson finished with 46 yards in five carries and his blocking sprung tailbacks Bennie Tate and Clifton Kersey as the Eagles blasted the Bulldogs 50-0 for Homecoming.

Saturday for the Eagles Homecoming, Bowie State College found out why that statement was appropos.

Central showed the Bulldogs why they were picked to finish as Southern Division champion as the Eagles destroyed Bowie 50-0 before 14,003 fans. NCCU did it with a crunching offense that churned out 480 yards for the game — 312 on the ground. Their M&G defense repelled all Bowie offenses limiting the Bulldogs to a minus 16 yards rushing and 103 yards through the airways.

The Eagles raised its mark to 4-1. They are 4-3 for the year. Bowie fell to 2-4, 4-4.

Many thought that it would be a close game. According to Bowie State coach John Organ, "I think that the environment was their strong point," talking about the large crowd. "Our kids haven't seen this many people. We were awed in a way."

After the first quarter, Bowie wasn't only awed by the crowd, they gained some more respect for freshman sensation Gerald Fraylon. Fraylon, the 8th leading scorer in the NCAA Division II, threw for three touchdowns and ran for another. He completed 8 of 16 passes for 157 yards. He now has 52 points on 8 touchdowns and four extra points.

Notwithstanding the scoreless first quarter, Central went to work and struck for three second quarter touchdowns and a safety. Junior cornerback Allen Pierce set up the first Central score with a 41 yard punt return to the BSC 22. Fraylon ran six yards around his right end before tossing a 16 yard scoring pass to Audrain Melton at 13:01. The extra point was blocked.

Central's defense stopped the Bulldogs on their next possession and another punt return gave the Eagles the ball at the BSC 39. Central marched to the seven where junior fullback-halback Bennie Tate burst up the middle, was hit and fumbled into the end zone. Bowie took over at its 20. On third and 14 from its 16, third string quarterback Lawrence Majors was hit by Lorenzo Ingram and Nate Johnson and fumbled the ball into his end zone. Bowie recovered and the Eagles were awarded a safety at 8:16.

The ensuing kick was taken by Carl Faison on the NCCU 49 and returned to the BSC 40. On the seventh play Fraylon tossed his second touchdown — this one a 23 yarder to freshman Paul Laney of Chapel Hill High. The pass for the two points was incomplete.

Unable to move on its next try, Bowie punted to the NCC 42. Central marched 58 yards on the ground in six plays with Tate going the final eight yards for the score up the middle. Tate, who had a career high 141 yards in 18 carries, rushed for 45 yards in the drive.

The Eagles took a 20-0 lead to the dressing room having run up 191 yards in total offense—93 rushing, 98 passing. The Bulldogs had been held to a minus 17 rushing and 25 passing.

The second half was more of the same for the Eagles as they scored on an 89-yard, 12-play drive over 5 minutes and 11 seconds. Fraylon scored his touchdown on a two

yard quarterback sneak. He also ran the two point conversion. Leading 28-0, Fraylon engineered his last drive that started late in the third stanza. The Eagles marched 91 yards over a three and a half minute period and scored when Fraylon threw his third td pass to Victor Hunter for 37 yards with 13:33 left in the game. Hunter and Fraylon hooked up for the extra points.

Reserve quarterback Greg Grayson, who had lost his job at the beginning of the year to once-injured Danny Smith and Fraylon, engineered a 73-yard, 8-play drive of 2 minutes, 48 seconds. Grayson sneaked for the final yard at 9:31 then ran for the extra points.

NCCU's final score came on a 20-yard interception by sophomore cornerback William Frizzell with 50 seconds to go.

"We really picked a beautiful day to put it together," exclaimed NCCU coach Henry Lattimore. "We didn't hurt ourselves today with the specialty teams and I can't say enough for the overall play of all the team members. This was truly a Homecoming celebration."

The Eagles held the Bulldogs to a minus 16 yards rushing and 103 through the airways. Central amassed 312 on the ground in 68 tries (the most yards rushing against Bowie—Va. Union had 309) and passed for another 168 (the most yards against Bowie this year—J. C. Smith got 158).

EAGLES NOTES:
The Eagles, first in the nation in the NCAA and second in the NAIA, saw their pass defense mark rise to 68.0 yards. They are allowing 148.9 yards in total offense (second in the nation)—80.9 rushing (12th in the NAIA).

Fraylon has now completed 35 of 108 passes for 544 yds and 6 tds...He has been intercepted 11 times...He leads the Eagles with 121.5 yards in total offense per game (2nd in the CIAA)...Fraylon has scored 52 points (8th in NCAA, 12th in NAIA) on 8 tds and 4 extra points.

The Eagles are averaging 151.4 yards rushing and 24.6 points per game (3rd in CIAA).
