

## Women-In-Action Honors Two Volunteer Programs

Two Durham Volunteer programs were given awards Wednesday night by Women-In-Action for the Prevention of Violence and Its Causes, Inc.

The St. Philips Soup Kitchen which has served meals to the needy since 1979 and the Delta Life Development Center, a tutoring program of the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority were honored for their contributions to the Durham Community.

Women-In-Action is a coalition of Durham women that seeks to remedy social conditions that contribute to violence. It was founded in 1968 by Mrs. Elna B. Spaulding, and serves as a counseling and mediating agency. It also helps to coordinate community aid programs.

The awards were made Wednesday night at a

banquet at the Downtowner Motor Inn. Addressing the group was Dan Hudgins, director of the Durham County Department of Social Services.

The St. Philips Soup Kitchen was suggested by Rev. C. Thommas Midgette, rector of St. Philips Episcopal Church on East Main Street. Each weekday from 10 a.m. to noon, the program feeds as many as 200 persons with meals of soup, sandwiches, milk, coffee or juice. Originally supported by the church, the meal program now has a broad base of supporting agencies in the Durham and Triangle area.

The Delta Life Development Center opened its doors in February, 1978. The Center was a yearround public service project of the Durham Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority. The Center, through its diagnostic and prescriptive programs, helped to improve the quality of life of the participants by upgrading reading and math skills. As an outgrowth of the Life Development Center, the Durham Deltas set up an after school tutorial program for eleventh and twelfth graders who needed help in passing the state required competency test. The program was highly commended by school principals.
