Two Winners Named For Scholarship Awards

Two Named Wheeler Scholars In NCCU School Of Business

Miss Johnnie Mae Adams, a junior accounting major from Fuquay-Varina, and James W. Lockhart, a senior management major from Garysburg, have been named winners of the 1981-82 John H. Wheeler Scholarships in the School of Business at North Carolina Central University.

The scholarships commemorate the late John H. Wheeler, long-time president of Mechanics and Farmers Bank, a civic and political leader in Durham for many years. Funding for the scholarships is provided

by the John H. Wheeler Foundation, whose president is Howard N. Lee.

Each scholarship has a value of \$1,000 and is awarded for the academic year.

Miss Adams is a junior at NCCU, an Alumni Scholar at the university, and a member of the National Association of Black Accountants. She plans a career as a Certified Public Accountant. She graduated from Harnett Central High School.

Lockhart, a senior, plans a career in business management. He is a

member of Iota Tau Chapter of Phi Beta Lambda, the National Student Business League, and the C.T. Willis Business Club at NCCU. He is a graduate of Gumberry High School.

Dean Tyrone R. Richmond of the NCCU School of Business said in announcing the awards, "Both Mr. Lockhart and Miss Adams are exemplary students at North Carolina Central University. We believe that in naming them as John H. Wheeler Scholars, we honor the memory of that nationally and internationally distinguished businessman and leader."
