# Fund Posts \$20,000 Bond For Black Man

NEW YORK — The Ecumenical Minority Bail Bond Fund has posted \$20,000 of the \$35,000 bail set for Ali Abdul-Mani, a black man from Washington, D.C., who is charged with conspiracy in a 1980 murder in the capital and with perjury before the Grand Jury.

Taking no position on the guilt or innocence of minority defendants, the fund works to secure their rights under the Eighth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, which prohibits excessive bail. Eight denominations have made up the fund, a program located in the National Council of Churches' Division of Church and Society.

Ali Abdul-Mani, also known as Lee Curtis Manning, is charged with renting the car used as a getaway car after the murder of Ali Akbar Tabatabai in July, 1980. Tabatabai was an Iranian citizen residing in the United States and was the president and leading spokesman of the Iran Freedom Foundation, "a non-profit

organization advocating a secular democratic government in Iran and the elimination of political persecution by the present government of Iran," according to documents from the Superior Court of the District of Columbia.

Further, Abdul-Mani is charged with perjuring himself before the Grand Jury investigating the case by denying receiving payment from one of the other alleged co-conspirators for renting the car.

"The bail required for Mr. Abdul-Mani is unreasonable, in our opinion," said Dr. Woodrow S. Carter, Sr., chairman of the fund and staff officer for social and specialized ministries of the Episcopal Church. "The Eighth Amendment guarantees everyone's right to bail and that bail will not be based on the alleged crime but on the likelihood of the person's showing up for trial."

"Mr. Abdul-Mani has no previous criminal record. In fact, he has

never been arrested. He has roots in the Washington community and is a homeowner and independent businessman there. He and his wife have responsibility for six children. In addition, when he read in the newspaper that he had been charged, he turned himself in," Carter said.

An additional incentive for the fund's involvement in the case is that Abdul-Mani, a Muslim, needs to be out of jail to gather evidence in his defense.

Carter pointed out that, in this case, the bonding agency required that half the amount of the bond be posted as collateral in addition to the usual ten percent premium, which was raised by Abdul-Mani's parents. It is the collateral that the Ecumenical Bail Bond Fund has provided.

# Widowhood Difficult For Men To Handle

There are more than five times as many widows 65 years and older as there are widowers.

"But numbers do not matter when the widower is your father, brother, cousin or neighbor," says Isabelle Buckley, extension aging specialist at North Carolina State University.

It is true that widowers usually have more money, job skills and experience in money management than widows, as well as being more socially sought-after, because single men are scarce.

But, says Miss Buckley, there is another side to the coin. Men usually have fewer close friends than women and a wife is also a confidant.

"Men traditionally have been free, independent and decision-makers, even in marriage, therefore they get less emotional support from families upon the death of a spouse," Miss Buckley notes.

Research studies find that widowhood can be just as traumatic and lonely for the older men who face it as for the women and they are twice as likely as older women to die within two years after the loss of a spouse, Miss Buckley says.

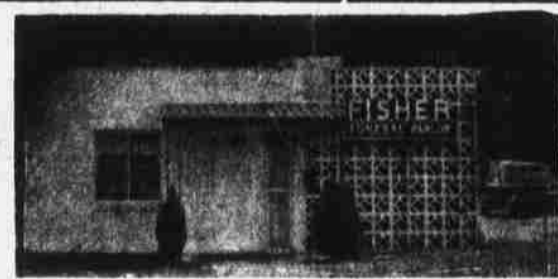
