

Dr. Ramona Edelin To Coordinate Three Year Plan

WASHINGTON

Dr. Ramona Edelin, vice president for Operations for the National Urban Coalition, has been given responsibility for coordinating the Coalition's three-year program for attacking the basic problems facing poor, minority and working class residents of urban areas in a time of budget cuts and changing policy. Coalition president M. Carl Holman announced this week.

Dr. Edelin is the daughter of Dr. Annette Phinazee, dean of the School of Library Sciences at North Carolina Central University, Durham.

Dr. Edelin joined the Coalition staff in 1977 after an outstanding career as activist, scholar and academic administrator. A Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Fisk University, Dr. Edelin did undergraduate work at Harvard, earned a M.A. degree in Philosophy at the University of East Anglia in Norwich, England and was awarded the Ph.D. in philosophy at Boston University.

Prior to joining the Coalition, Dr. Edelin was founder and chairman of the Department of African-American Studies at Northeastern University in Boston. She has taught at Brandeis University and Emerson College and

was lecturer in logic at the University of Maryland, European Division.

"Dr. Edelin has brought to her work at the Coalition the skills and insights gained in her early days as a student worker with the Southern Christian Leadership Conference and the years she spent as an analyst and interpreter of African and African-American culture," said Holman. "She will be responsible for the day-to-day coordination of the Coalition's three-pronged effort to find workable answers to the problems of linking education and training to private sector jobs; maintaining adequate housing and economic development; and stemming the erosion of services and the quality of life in urban neighborhoods at a time when federal funds have been slashed to the bone and the people of urban communities must fend for themselves with the limited assistance of states, localities and the private sector."

Mrs. Dunnegan lives on St. Mary's Road in Durham County.



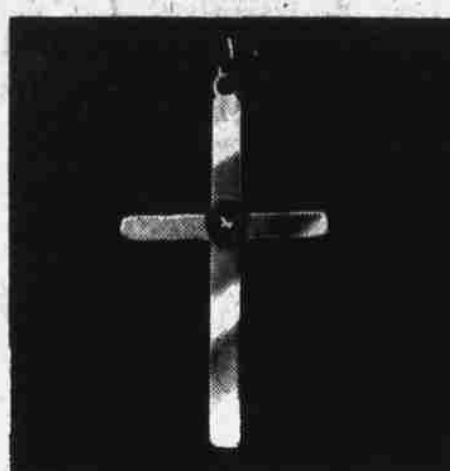

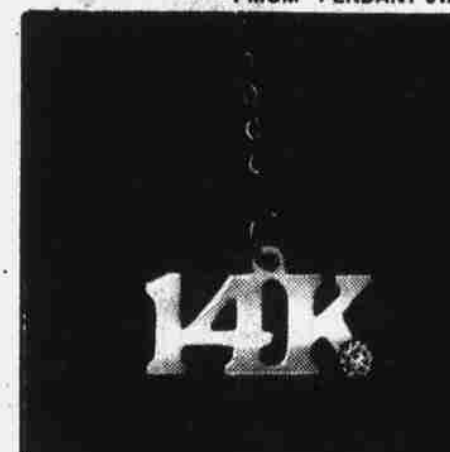

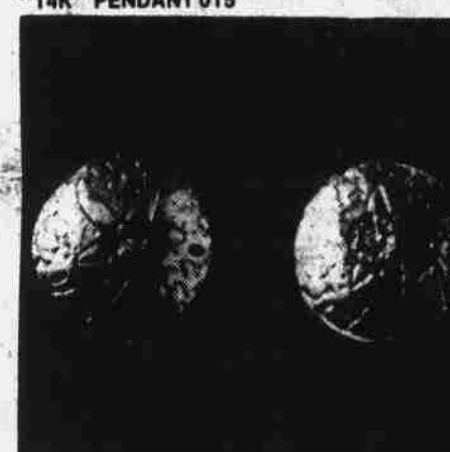
