CPR To Be Taught In Triangle Area

Classes in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) are currently being coordinated in the region by the Triangle J. Council of Governments. These classes are designed to teach people how to help save a heart attack victim's life.

This is the second year of a two year effort to train five per cent of the region's citizens in this life saving technique. More than 11,000 persons in the six counties of Chatham, Durham, Johnston, Lee, Orange, and Wake have already received the training.

Local chapters of the American Red Cross, The North Carolina Heart Association, several community colleges, and local Emergency Medical Services rescue squads offer CPR classes. Interested can contact their local chapter of these organizations or call the TJCOG at 549-0551 for more information.

According to TJCOG's CPR project coordinator, Ms. Mary Ford, CPR classes can usually be completed in 8 to 12 hours of instruction given over two to three days. Students learn how to give basic life support to adults as well as learn special life saving techniques for children and infants. They also learn how to help save a choking victim's life.

The TJCOG received a grant from the North Carolina Office of Emergency Medical Services to coordinate CPR classes in its six-county region.

St. Aug. To Offer Real Estate Courses January 13

RALEIGH — Real Estate Comprehensive Pre-Licensing Education courses are now being offered at Saint Augustine's College through its evening Continuing Program. Classes are scheduled to begin January 13. The program is designed to provide participants with basic knowledge and skills for entry into the real estate profession either as a salesman or a broker. The program also provides a course of study for real estate licensees wishing to further their education. A secondary objective is to prepare for the real estate salesman and/or broker licensing examination. The course syllabi have been approved by the North Carolina Real Estate Licensing Board and satisfy the educational requirements of applicants for both licenses. Instructors for the courses are real estate professionals who have been certified by the North Carolina Real Estate Licensing Board.

The program consists of three 48-hour sessions of classroom study and lecture. Courses offered include the following: Real Estate Principles and Practices — consists of instruction in fundamental real estate principles including real estate law, financing, brokerage, valuation and taxation; Real Estate Finance — designed to provide participants with practical knowledge of real estate financing concepts and practices; and, Real Estate Law — will provide students with a practical working knowledge of legal concepts and practices affecting real estate and brokerage.
