Rev. Sullivan Launches Jobs Crusade

PHILADELPHIA — "The end is not yet" declared Rev. Leon Sullivan, the pastor of Zion Baptist Church, Philadelphia, as he prepared for a nationwide swing from coast to coast appealing to 5,000 business leaders to make youth job pledges.

Referring to the **Biblical** expression that tells believers "to endure to the end," Rev. Sullivan, founder and chairman of the Opportunities Industrialization Centers of America (OIC/A) job training network, announced to his National Industrial Advisors his Youth Jobs Crusades plan. He asked his business advisors to meet and mobilize small medium-sized and businesses to join in a private sector initiative that will bring some hope to the unemployed youth of America.

"We must invest in America's future, even while we endure the pain of the present economic -recession," Rev. --Sullivan said. Outlining a six-month plan that will involve the Industrial Advisory Councils of the local OIC affiliates as well as OIC volunteer leaders in more than 100 communities, Rev. Sullivan spoke with deep feeling about the crisis in federal funding and the need to have private sector initiatives move as quickly a possible to bridge the gap!

Rev. Sullivan said, "The business leaders who put President Reagan in office have been saying, 'let's have less government; the private sector can do it better.' Well, here's their chance. The performance of business in like areas youth unemployment and training has, up to now, been disappointing. Only one big company in ten contributes significantly to this area. But there are 13 million companies in this country and if only one per cent would hire one youth, we will have gone a long way toward solving the problem. I am beginning the Jobs for Youth Crusade to launch a national campaign to put OIC in the hearts and minds of America." Rev. Sullivan pointed out, "not only is the survival of the existing OIC's at stake, but the stabilization of our communities, reduction of crime, and the providing of an alternative to hopelesness and despair compels me to undertake this task."

(Continued from P. ge 14) mable liquid can destro or severly damage you home.

You should open the damper near the stove before starting a fire. Build the fire on a shallow bed of ashes which provides a heat reflecting surface. Use a small amount of crumpled paper and cover it with a few small sticks of wood (kindling). You can add larger pieces when the draft is started up the chimney.

Your woodstove can help you save energy, but improper installation or careless use can cost you everything.
