League Urges Relief For Hatians

PALM-BEACH, FL. — The Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith has urged the enactment of federal legislation that would promptly decide the fate of thousands of Haitians seeking asylum in this country.

In a resolution adopted at ADL's National Executive Committee meeting at The Breakers hotel recently, the agency said the Haitian situation points up the inadequacy of existing immigration law.

The resolution urged "on humanitarian grounds the expeditious enactment of legislation to provide that the status of those who seek asylum in the United States be promptly determined in a manner which is timely, fair, evenhanded and humane." The League further urged that the cost of dealing with the problem be absorbed by the federal government and not locally.

The resolution was introduced by Richard Essen of Miami, a member of the National Executive Committee and of ADL's Florida Regional Board. Essen, with other Florida leaders, had visited the Krome Avenue camp in Miami.

He said "the facility is clean, medical and dental care is adequate — but it is overcrowded, people want their freedom and the camp should be closed."

ADL is particularly sensitive to the plight of the Haitian refugees because Jews, themselves, have been refugees all too frequently throughout history, he said.

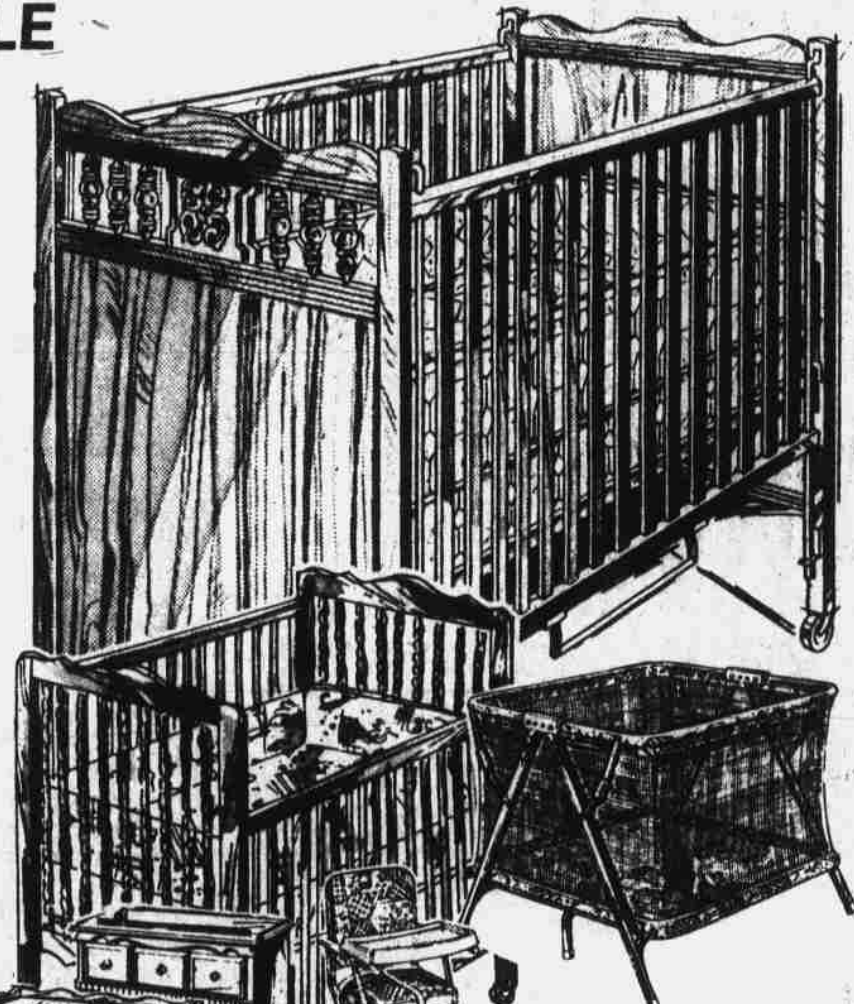
