**Career Options for Nurses** on Saturday, March 13, is a daylong workshop to explore options and career alternatives for nurses. The morning session will deal with alternative work patterns, new specialties in nursing, continuing education, and other news in the field. The afternoon small group sessions will help participants in self-assessment of values, skills, and interests, and the use of that information in choosing career options. The day's fee is \$40 or \$25 for either session. Instructors are the counselors of the Duke University Peer Counseling Service.

**VIDEOTAPES** — A group of 22 videotapes of local events, people, and places has been presented to the Durham Public Library by Durham Technical Institute. The videotapes were produced by Media Services Department at Durham Tech working with other groups in the city and include a portion of the Arts in Durham series which was produced in cooperation with the Durham Arts Council. The videotapes feature interviews with local artists Brother Yusef, Nancy Tuttle May, and John Page and performances by dance companies, jazz musicians, and folk groups. The public is invited to view the videotapes in the Audio-Visual Department at the Durham County Library.

**DUKE UNIVERSITY CHORALE** — On Tuesday, March 16 at 8:15 p.m., the Duke University Chorale will perform the final concert of their 1982 Spring Concert Tour of the Southeast. This will be the first musical performance to be held in the beautiful Reynolds Theatre of the newly-opened Bryan University Center on Duke's West Campus.

The program will include sacred works by C.P.E. Bach, Palestrina, Kodaly and Faure, as well as secular works by Brahms and Randall Thompson. The performance will also feature selections from Broadway and a medley of songs from the Roaring Twenties.
