Raleigh could receive quite a storm, as opposed to other areas," Cheatham added.

This reporter believes this was the case when a 'localized tornado' that hit the Redwood section of Durham (4 miles northeast of the city) on August 10, 1980.

That day had been very hot in downtown Durham. Downtown thermometers were showing 108 degree readings. Late that evening Redwood was hit by the severe, damaging winds while the rest of the city and county went unscathed.

When asked if April 8 was the first April snow ever here, Cheatham produced some weather records that showed that while snow is rare in the Triangle in April, it has actually snowed as late as May! On May 2, 1939, a trace (less than a quarter-inch) of snow was recorded here. A measurable snow (less than an inch) was recorded here on April 6, 1889. A greater than 1-inch snowfall was recorded at Raleigh-Durham on April 4, 1889, and even a heavy (more than 4 inches) April snow was recorded here in 1915.

Prepare Beds For Azaleas Plenty Early

The plants may not be put in them until next spring, but you can go ahead with preparation of beds for azaleas.

North Carolina State University extension horticulturists suggest rototilling to work the bed into good planting condition. Of course, you can do it with a shovel or other tool, if the rototiller isn't available.

If the soil is poor and hard, it will pay in the long run to work in a three or four-inch layer of organic matter. Peat moss or old sawdust are two materials that work well.

If you use fairly new sawdust, nitrogen should be added to the soil for the first two or
