Students Hold "Pro Eagle" Banquet

Three alumni of the North Carolina Central University Eagles, now professional football stars, have accepted invitations to speak at a Pro Eagle Banquet Saturday, April 24, according to representatives of the NCCU Student Government Association.

Doug Wilkerson of the San Diego Chargers, Louis Breeden of the Cincinnati Bengals, and Reggie "Super Gnat" Smith of the Atlanta Falcons will speak at the 8 p.m. banquet at the W.G. Pearson Cafeteria, according to Leon Rouson and Ms. Belinda Jones, who co-chair the Student Government Association's Student Athletic Committee.

The three football

stars will also conduct a clinic for the area's high school and junior college players. Information about the clinic has been sent to coaches at area schools. It will begin at 9 a.m. Saturday, April 24, at the university's O'Kelly Stadium.

Reservations for the banquet and registrations for the clinic are being accepted at the Student Government offices in NCCU's Alfonso Elder Student Union. For information, call 683-6121 or 683-6497.

Ticket prices for the banquet are \$5 for NCCU students and \$8 for non-students (\$15 a couple). The registration fee for the clinic, which includes a continental breakfast and lunch, is \$5.

Durham's Hunter Meets Legendary UCLA Coach John Wooden

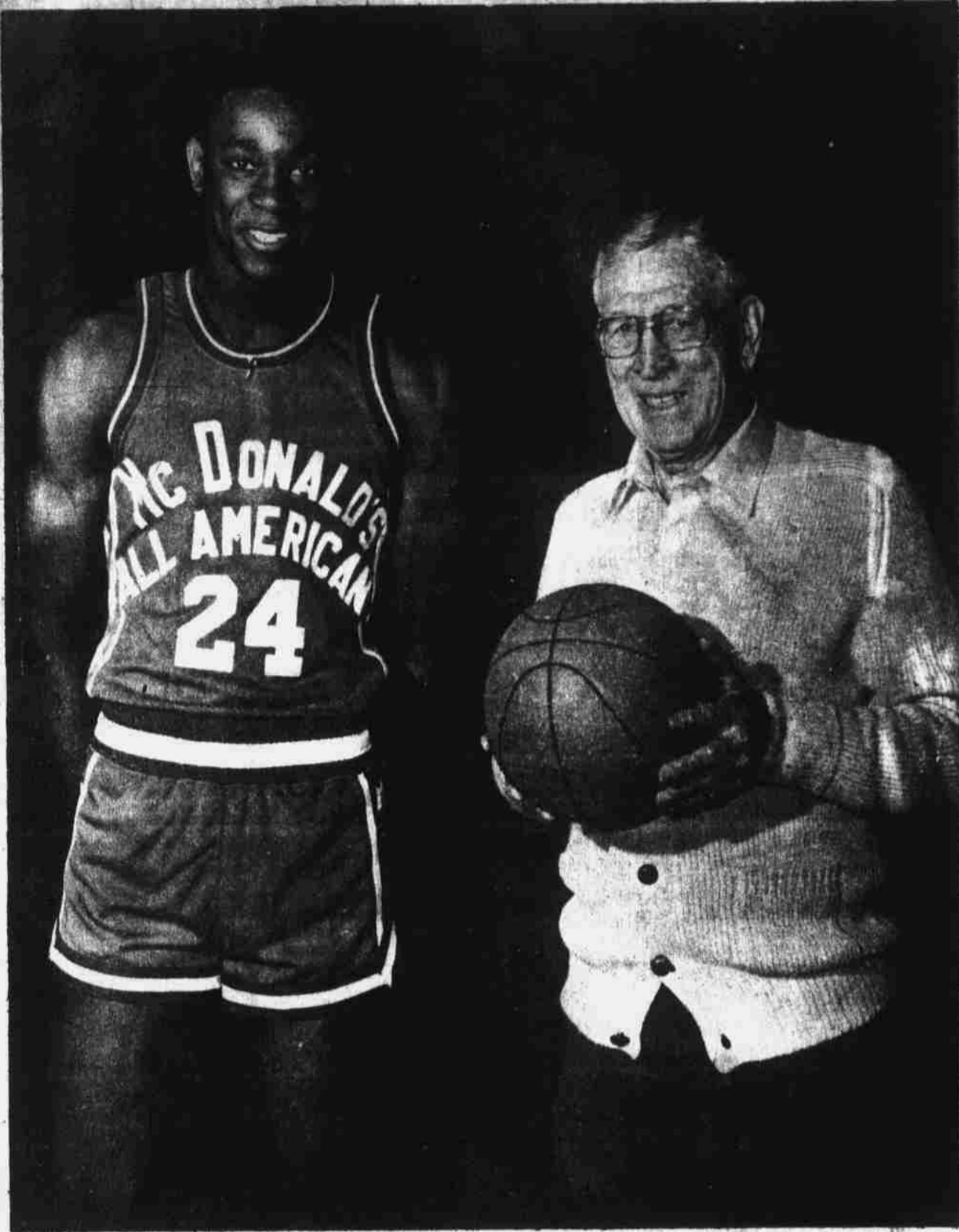
Hunter was among the nation's top 25 high school senior basketball players named to the 1982 McDonald's All American High School Basketball Team™, often described by coaches, sports writers and scouts as America's "Dream Team".

Former McDonald's All Americans include Isiah Thomas, Detroit Pistons; Earvin "Magic" Johnson, Los Angeles Lakers; Mark

Aguirre, Dallas Mavericks; Patrick Ewing, Georgetown; Sam Perkins and James Worthy, North Carolina; Ralph Sampson, Virginia; and Steve Stipanovich, Missouri.

Wooden, chairman of the McDonald's All American High School Basketball Team Advisory Committee, led the UCLA Bruins to an unequalled ten NCAA (seven consecutive) championships.

Hunter played on the East squad during the McDonald's All American Game, the only event which brings together the nation's top prep cagers to compete in an East-West format. The West won East, 103-84, during the fifth annual contest.

Jordan In Close Race For Wachovia Cup

At the end of the winter high school sports season, John Wilkinson High in Belhaven is ahead in the 1-A Wachovia Cup race. Camp Lejeune High is winning in 2-A competition, Watauga High in Boone leads in the 3-A race, and Chapel Hill Senior High once again leads in 4-A Wachovia Cup competition.

Races are close in Class 1-A, with Edneyville High behind John Wilkinson by only five points, and in Class 3-A, with Durham Jordan trailing Watauga by only ten points.

The Wachovia Cup award, sponsored by the North Carolina High School Athletic Association (NCHSAA) and Wachovia Bank and Trust Company, recognizes four schools every year which have the best overall athletic programs in the state. Schools receive points based on performance against other schools in their own classification in state championship events, and points are also awarded for participation in NCHSAA-sanctioned sports.

In the 1-A race, Wilkinson, leading with 152½ points, won the championship in boys

basketball, advanced to the regional finals in 1-A girls basketball, and received ten points for participating in two of the five sanctioned winter sports. Edneyville, with 147½ points, was a regional finalist in 1-A boys and girls basketball, and received fifteen points for participating in three sanctioned sports. Robbinville, in third place with 142½ points, finished second in 1-A wrestling, advanced to the regional semifinals in 1-A girls basketball, and received fifteen participation points.

In the 2-A Wachovia Cup race, Camp Lejeune, with 180 points, finished first among 2-A schools in girls swimming and received twenty participation points. Ledford High in Thomasville, in second place with 140 points, finished first in 2-A boys swimming and received twenty participation points.

Watauga has 250 points in the 3-A race, closely followed by Jordan with 240 points. Watauga came in third in 3-A boys swimming, finished eighth in girls swimming, and advanced

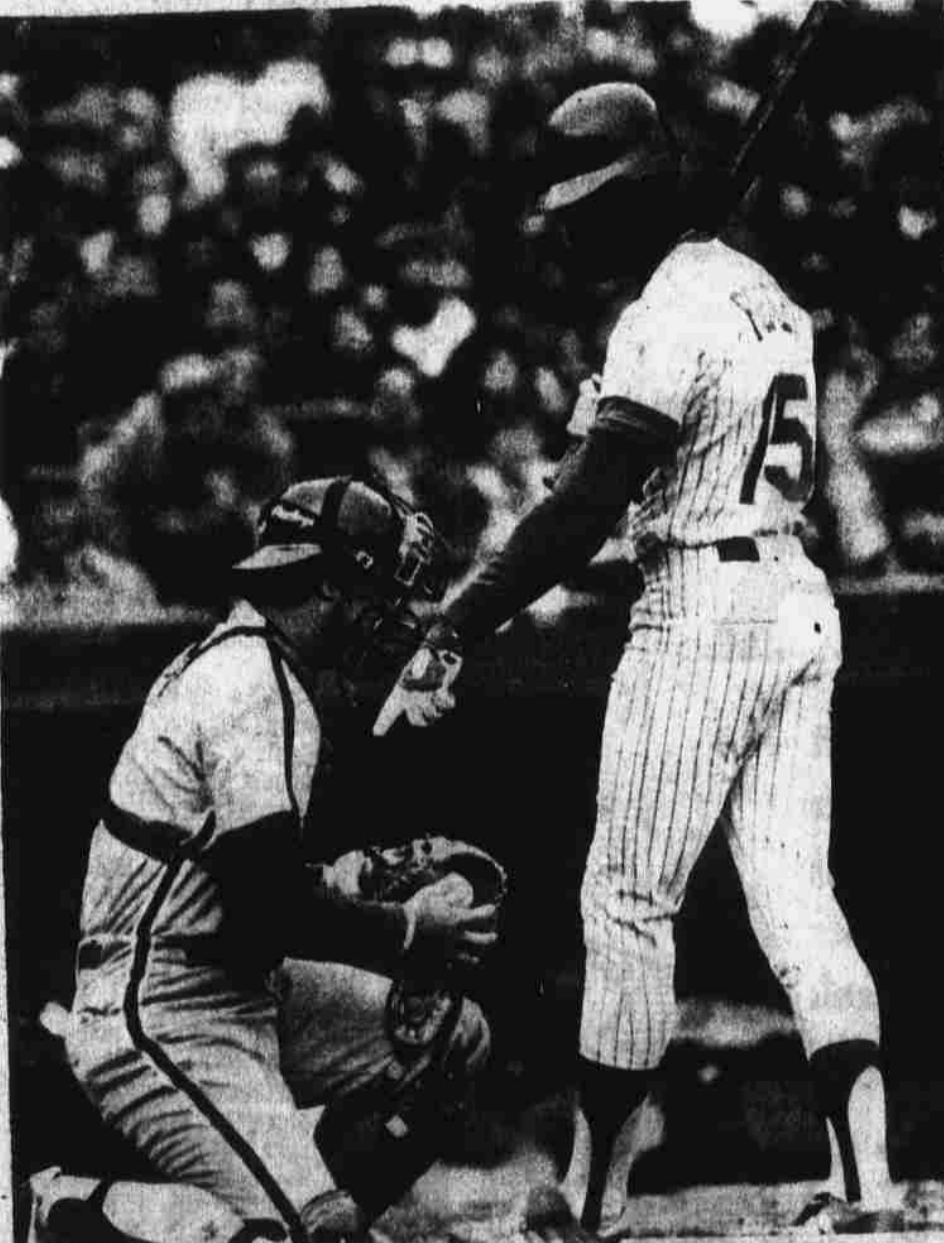
