A Cook-In Barbecue

Break out for Spring! Plan a cook-in barbecue that features country-style ribs (or double burgers with barbecue sauce), Cheese spoon bread, a dish of collard greens and grapefruit-banana ambrosia. The barbecue sauce for the ribs is made succulent with condensed tomato soup and whole plums. The spoon bread also takes advantage of the full flavored condensed cream of chicken soup to achieve a mellow taste. Add your favorite pot of greens and finish with a light ambrosia — and welcome Spring. Enjoy!

Barbecued Country Ribs

- 6 lbs. country style spareribs, cut into serving-size pieces
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 1 tablespoon butter or margarine
- 1 can (about 16 oz.) whole purple plums
- 1 can (10 1/4 oz.) Campbell's Condensed Tomato Soup
- 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/4 cup red wine vinegar
- 1 tablespoon celery seed
- 1 tablespoon chili powder
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire
- 1 teaspoon salt

In a large pan, cover spareribs with water. Simmer 1 hour; drain. Meanwhile, to make sauce, in saucepan, cook onion in butter until tender. Drain plums, reserving syrup. Remove seeds from plums. In electric blender, combine plums and onion mixture; blend until smooth. Return mixture to saucepan. Stir in reserved syrup and remaining ingredients; simmer 15 minutes. Stir occasionally. Arrange spareribs on broiler pan; brush with sauce. Broil 4 inches from heat 20 minutes or until done, turning and brushing with sauce. Serve with remaining sauce. Makes 6 to 8 servings.

Cheese Spoon Bread

- 1 cup cornmeal
- 1 1/2 cups boiling water
- 1 can (10 1/4 oz.) Condensed Cream

- of Chicken Soup
- 3/4 cup light cream
- 1 cup shredded Cheddar Cheese
- 3 eggs, separated
- 1/4 cup butter or margarine
- 1 tablespoon chopped green onion
- 1/2 teaspoon salt

In bowl, combine cornmeal and boiling water; stir until smooth. Stir in soup, cream, cheese, egg yolks, butter, onion and salt. Beat egg whites until stiff peaks form; fold into cornmeal mixture. Pour into greased 2-quart casserole. Bake 40 to 45 minutes or until done. Makes 8 servings.

Double Burgers With Barbecue Sauce

- 2 pounds ground beef
- 1 teaspoon salt
- Generous dash pepper
- 8 thin slices cucumber
- 8 thin slices onion
- 1/4 cup chopped celery
- 1 large clove garlic, minced
- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 1 can (10 1/4 oz.) Campbell's Condensed Tomato Soup
- 1/4 cup water
- 1/4 cup chopped chow chow (relish)
- 1 tablespoon brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire
- 5 drops hot pepper sauce

Combine beef and seasonings. Shape into 16 thin patties. On half of the patties, place a cucumber and onion slice. Top with remaining patties and seal edges. Meanwhile, in saucepan, cook celery with garlic in butter until tender. Add remaining ingredients. Cook over low heat for 15 minutes or until desired doneness, turning and basting with sauce every 5 minutes. Serve with remaining sauce. Makes 8 servings.
