The Gap Band Fills Top Chart Slots

"The Gap Band is: filling the spaces between musical forms, filling the holes, the gaps," says Ronnie Wilson. The Gap Band also fills the top chart slots with songs like "Burn Rubber" (a No. 1 R&B single as well as a pop hit), and "Yearnin" (Top 10 R&B and Top 40 pop) from The Gap Band III, now a platinum album filling the spaces on their already crowded walls. And there's no better opener for this slice of the Gap Band's musical magic than the single, "Early In The Morning," a scintillating ray of musical sunshine that should brighten the dance floors and radio waves of America. "We hit all the targets a little deeper," explains producer Lonnie Simmons, and in the year and a half since recording the

Explosive cuts like "You Dropped the Bomb on Me'' and "Talkin' Back," build on The Gap Band's irresistable uptempo style found on previous cuts like "Burn Rub-ber," "Humpin" and "Oops (Upside Your Head)," while the Gap Band also continues to develop it's knack for beautifully wrought love songs on "Season's No Reason to Change" and "I Can't Get Over you." Fans of the hit, "Yearnin'," will revel in the Gap Band's immaculate mastery of ballads on such cuts as "Lonely Like Me" and "Stay With Me," or the heartwarming ode to women and "Outstanding." romance, Rife with vocal and instrumental thrills, The Gap Band IV promises to leach and touch everybody with a total musical experience.

Such versatility and winning musical style reflects. The Gap Band's heritage and experience. The group's three Wilson Brothers (Ronnie, Charles and Robert) grew up in Tulsa, Oklahoma, the sons of a minister. Their first musical exposure came as members of the church choir.

The group Ronnie later founded was named The Gap Band from an acronym for the three main arteries at the heart of Tulsa's black business community - Greenwood, Archer and Pine Streets, and from the beginning, due to their versatility, The Gap Band has been able to successfully mix R&B with firm pop appeal. Local Tulsa rock 'n' roll star and record producer Leon Russell was so impressed with the Gap Band that he had them perform with him in concerts across the country. The Gap Band's musical breadth even found them playing with the likes of rock giants The Rolling Stones and Kansas.

In '78, all three Wilson Brothers were now members of The Gap Band, and had come to the attention of record producer and night club owner, Lonnie Simmons. Signing the band to his Total Experience Productions, Simmons and the Gap Band entered into a creative collaboration that has brought the group to the forefront of the black music and pop scenes. With the recent formation of Total Experience Records, Simmons and the Gap Band promise to fill even more musical spaces than ever before.

Easy Grilling For Two

If you think of outdoor cooking only in terms of picnics, parties or family reunions—think again. With a little bit of planning and the right accessories, it's as convenient, easy and fun to barbecue for two as it is for a crowd.

First, choose the right size grill, such as a small brazier or hibachi. To keep clean-up time to a minimum, line the firebox with foil and spray the rack with a nonstick vegetable oil coating.

To start the fire quickly and easily, use an instantlighting charcoal like Match light that needs no lighter fluid and is ready to cook on in about 20 minutes.

The convenience of this charcoal makes it a natural when you want to be sure the fire gets off to a good start with no hassle. Because this pre-treated charcoal is ready to cook on in about half the time of regular charcoal, it makes the pleasure of barbecuing possible even on busy work days.

Any charcoal has a tendency to absorb moisture if left in an open bag for several months. For best results, buy smaller amounts and store unused briquets in a lidded,

airtight container. If you must store in the bag, be sure to seal tightly and store in a dry location.

Just because you're barbecuing for two doesn't mean you can't shop economically. In fact, outdoor grilling can make food planning easier!

Take advantage of special buys on larger or less tender cuts of meat. At home, simply divide the pieces into mealsize portions, place in plastic bags, add different marinating sauces according to your taste and imagination, and freeze.

As dinner thaws, the marinade will tenderize and flavor the meat. You can get a wide range of tastes simply by varying your combination of marinade ingredients.

Help keep energy costs down by planning your entire menu around the grill. Vegetables, fruits, and bread can all be cooked in foil over the costs. To cut cooking times, parboil fresh vegetables first, and turn all packets occasionally to insure even cooking.
