# Spaulding Leads Ticket For State House—Clement Weak

Tuesday's state house election results for the 23rd legislative district surprised Kenneth B. Spaulding more than anyone else. Not only did he retain the legislative seat he's held for the past four years, but he also led the ticket in the four-man race for the three seats in this district. Spaulding polled more than 18,000 votes.

"I think the vote reflects the willingness of the community to work together," Spaulding said shortly after results were announced at election headquarters downtown. "My voting record shows that we've worked for the whole community, and I'm glad the voters allowed me to continue the service."

Durham County voters also returned two other incumbent legislators to the state house in Tuesday's elections. W. Paul Pulley, who will begin his third term, came in second place with about 14,000 votes, while George Miller, Jr., placed third with about 13,000 votes. A.J. Howard Cle-

ment, III, a black insurance executive, came in a distant fourth place, with just a little over 9,000 votes.

A comparison of election returns indicate that if Clement had polled an average of about 400 more votes in each of the city's ten predominantly black precincts, he would have placed third, upsetting Miller. However, because Clement ran without the endorsement of the Durham Committee on the Affairs of Black People, he got only about 2,200 votes in those ten precincts. Spaulding got the Committee's endorsement. The Committee is Durham's principal black political organization. This is the second race in which Spaulding has received the Committee's endorsement rather than Clement, and each time the endorsement made a major difference in the votes Clement got in the black community. Spaulding, however, also ran strong in predominantly white areas. Although many political figures thought

Spaulding's vote against a three cent gas tax hike, proposed by Gov. Jim Hunt and supported by most of the Durham delegation, would hurt his reelection chances. Voters evidently thought that he did a good job. While neither would state it in uncertain terms publicly, the house race was viewed by many as a battle between Spaulding and Clement, as it turned out. Clement could only muster 9,126 votes, over 4,000 votes beyond the race's third place candidate. Clement and Spaulding, though both black, seldom agreed on issues that came before the House during the last term, with Clement often speaking publicly against Spaulding's positions. The race reset the stage from a political battle originally set in the general elections of 1978. That year, A.J. Howard Clement III sought to retain the seat he filled following the

appointment to U.S. Attorney of H.M. Michaux. But Kenneth Spaulding decided to run also, and he, too, received the backing of the politically powerful Durham Committee on the Affairs of Black People, the famous, "double endorsement". Spaulding won along with the two white candidates that ran successfully in 1978 and 1980, Paul Pulley and George Miller. Clement sought the committee's endorsement this year but Spaulding won that fight again. The three incumbents ran mostly on their records. Except for a few issues they all agree and vote as a bloc or delegation. Clement, on the other hand, ran on as record as private citizens and through certain community organizations such as the Durham Chamber of Commerce.

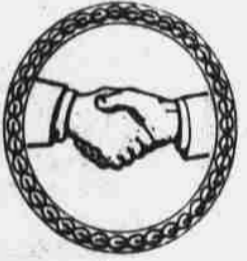
