Local Calls

Vote On

General Telephone customers in Durham have an opportunity this month to express their preference concerning the establishment of local calling service to Hillsborough at an increased monthly rate.

Telephone bills issued betwen July 7 and August 1 will contain a self-addressed, post-paid ballot on which each customer may vote for or against establishment of the service at a proposed monthly rate increase of 35 cents for residential customers and 85 cents business customers.

The wording on the ballot, issued by the N. C. Utilities Commission, points out that if local calling to Hillsborough is established, the accompanying rate increase would be based on the cost of providing the service at that time and could vary from the examples cited above.

General Telephone Co. has said that it would be willing to provide the service if a majority of its customers indicated they wanted local calling to Hillsborough at increased rates and if the Utilities Commission

would approve it.
"For those who call Hills bor ough frequently," said Claude O. Sykes, the company's vice-president and general manager in North Carolina, "we already offer an 'optional calling plan.' It provides the frequent caller with a substantial discount while imposing no cost at all on those who place no calls to

Hillsborough." The results of this poll will not be binding on the N.C. Utilities Commission, which ultimate-ly will decide whether local calling is to be established between Durham Hillsborough. The Commission has however, that public preference, as expressed in the balloting, will have considerable influence on their decision.
