House speaker Tip O'Neill and "obstructionist liberal" and said that the economic philosophy of the national Democratic leader should be rejected by blacks.

When asked whether Marin had any blacks on his paid staff, Harrell said that he did not, but that blacks were "volunteering" in the campaign effort. "We have at least a dozen black volunteers," Harrell added.
