Eagles And Spartans Clash In Norfolk

It's two nationally ranked squads competing on Norfolk's Foreman Field, Saturday, October 9 at 1:30 p.m. At stake will be a continued undefeated season and leadership in one's respective division.

The Eagles of North Carolina Central are ranked 5th in the NCAA Division II while the Spartans of Norfolk State are 7th in the NAIA. Both the Eagles and Spartans boast outstanding offensive

and defensive squads. Central leads the CIAA in passing offense (169.8), total offense (361.0) and scoring offense (31.5). They are fourth in rushing offense at 191.3. Leading the Central attack is the multi-talented sophomore signalcaller Gerald Fraylon. Fraylon leads the conference in passing and total offense. He has completed 43 of 89 passes for 679 yards and 6 touchdowns. He has rushed for

another 58 yards. His favorite receiver is senior wide receiver Victor Hunter. Hunter is fifth in the CIAA in receptions with 17 catches for 336 yards and three tds. Tight end James Foster is second with 7 catches for another 75 yards and a score.

Senior All-American candidate Benny Tate leads the conference in rushing and scoring with 419 yards and 7 touchdowns. He had a career-high 175 yards in 30 attempts against Fayetteville State last week.

The Spartans can counter with a fine quarterback in junior Raynard Revels. He has

been true on 25 of 51 passes for 343 yards and a pair of touchdowns. His favorite receiver is senior Jeff Gunn. Gunn has caught 9 passes for 144 yards and 1 score. Orlando Goodhope and George Parker are two fine runningbacks.

Goodhope leads the Spartans and is second in the CIAA with 359 yards on 50 carries. He has scored 4 times. Parker has picked up 249 yards on 33 attempts. He set a school record with a 96 yard scamper last week against Winston-Salem.

The Spartans lead the CIAA in rushing offense having picked 224 yards per contest. They have amassed 315.3 yards per

contest in total offense.

Defensively, the Eagles and Spartans are two of the stingiest teams in the league. The Eagles have allowed a league leading 55.0 yards through the airways and are ranked second in total defense at 195.5. The Spartans are on top in total defense having allowed 163.5 yards per game. They are giving up 100.8 on the ground.

Against common opponents Norfolk beat Fayetteville State 26-6 and Winston-Salem 16-7. Central beat those teams 20-15 and 37-17 respectively.

The Eagles upended Norfolk 27-20 last year (Continued on Page 7)

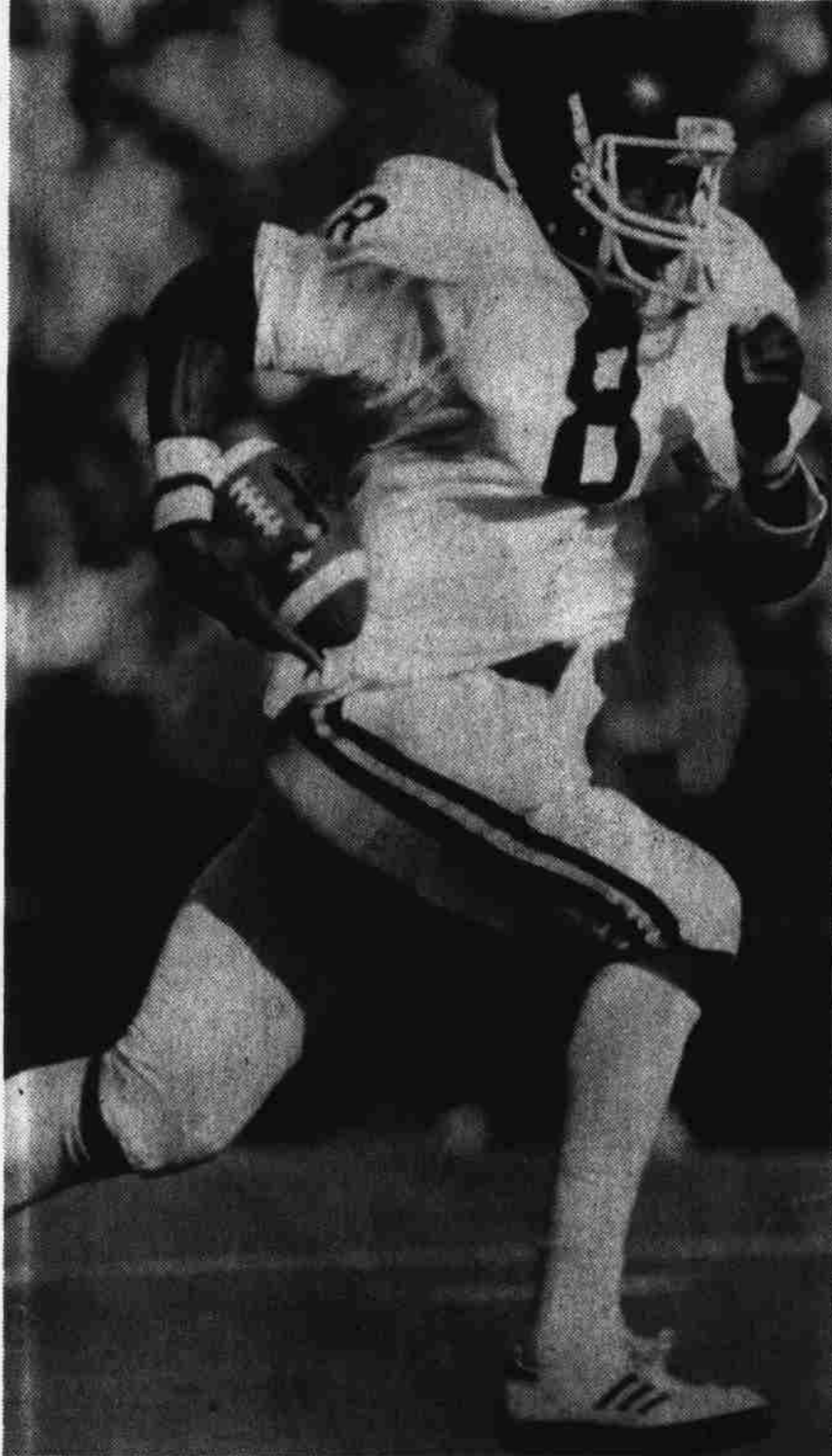
