**Network Calls For National Response To KKK March**

WASHINGTON — Leaders of the nation's principal clearing-house for counter-Klan activity have issued a call for a major national response to the planned Ku Klux Klan march in Washington on November 6.

"The Klan must detect some sympathy from the heights of power," said Rev. C.T. Vivian, chair of the Atlanta-based National Anti-Klan Network. "The KKK is marching on Washington for the first time since 1926 and they can come because the Federal government has refused to stop their racist and religious violence in its tracks."

Billed as a "Rally for Human Dignity and Against Racist & Religious Violence" the Network leaders are hoping to show that the vast majority of American oppose the Klan. "The problem is not the lack of opposition sentiments," said Vivian, "but that too many have stayed silent — hoping the Klan would just 'go away'. It is the passivity of America that has allowed the KKK to exist for 120 years."

In addition to the counter-Klan theme, the

rally will underscore the need for respect for Human Dignity. The Network contends that the "New Klan" is not different from the old and remains violently opposed to any concept of human dignity or equal rights.

Ms. Lyn Wells, coordinator of the Network, has been closely monitoring the new Klan Confederation formed in Georgia over Labor Day which has called for the November 6 Klan march. "The new Confederation of Klans is a dangerous collection of Nazis and known murderers — a coalition of open admirers of Adolph Hitler, church and school bus bombers, and the convicted killers of the three civil rights workers in Mississippi in 1964," she contends.

The planned Rally will assemble at 12 noon on November 6 in front of the District Building and will march to the U.S. Department of Justice where it will present its demands.

The National Anti-Klan Network was founded in 1979 following the outbreak of Ku Klux Klan violence in Decatur, Alabama. Included among its 52 affiliates are national
