## 113th Anniversary of St. Joseph's

St. Joseph's A.M.E. Church, 2515 Fayetteville St., will observe its 113th Anniversary, Sunday, October 24. Bishop Philip R. Cousin, former Minister of St. Joseph's and now Presiding Bishop of the Ninth Episcopal District of the African Methodist Episcopal Church, Birmingham, Ala., will preach at the 11 a.m. Worship Service.

While serving as Pastor of St. Joseph's he led the congregation into relocating the church from 804 Fayetteville St. to 2521 Fayetteville St. He was elected the 96th Bishop of the A.M.E. Church in Atlanta, Ga. in June 1976. He became the first Minister of St. Joseph's and the first in North Carolina to be elevated to the Episcopacy in the A.M.E. Church. Bishop Cousin is the last black to serve on the Durham County School Board.

Music will be furnished by the Mass Choir. A Fellowship Dinner will be served following the service in the Edian Markham Multi-Purpose Room. Attorney William A. Marsh Jr. is chairman for the 113th Anniversary Celebration. Rev. W. W. Easley Jr. is minister.
