MEAC Players Of The Week

Offensive Player of the Week Mike Jones, a North Carolina A'1 State University runningback, has been named MEAC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance in Saturday's 13-7 victory over NCCU. Jones rushed for a gamehigh 113 yards on 26 attempts. He is a 6-1, 185-pound sophomore Youngstown, from Ohio.

Offensive Lineman of the Week - Franz Kappel, an offensive tackle of Delaware State College is the MEAC's top lineman this week, for his play in the 15-7 win over Northeastern. The 6-3, 260-pound sophomore keyed the Hornet blocking, and graded 90 per cent on the game film, the highest mark for a DelState lineman this season. Kappel, a track and field star as well as an accomplished weight lifter, is from New Cas-

tle, Delaware. Defensive Player of the Week - Tim Gray, a Delaware linebacker has been selected as the MEA Defensive Player of th Week for his inspired e. forts in the victory against Northeastern. Gray returned a blocked punt 44 yards for a touchdown, intercepted a pass, recorded six solo (Continued On Page 7)

Panthers Win Second Straight CIAA Crown

CHARLOTTE -Virginia Union held off a stubborn North Carolina Central team and won its second straight CIAA crown with a 33-26 victory over the Eagles. The Southern Division Champion Virginia Union Panthers (8-2) face North Dakota State Saturday in the NCAA Division II playoff in Fargo, N.D. They racked up 248 yards rushing and passed for another 104 as the Panthers avenged an earlier 27-26

loss to Central.

Sophomore quarterback John Johnson rushed for one touchdown and threw for another as the Panthers bolted to a 14-0 lead after 16 minutes of play. Central got on the scoreboard at 11:30 of the second period when sophomore quarterback Gerald Fraylon threw an 8 yard pass to senior receiver Victor Hunter. A 39 yard interception by All-CIAA safety Allen Pierce set up the scoring caught 7 passes for 105

on the next VUU posses-sion. From the NCCU 38 was two yards short of Mitch Boule, a reserve tight end on a post pat-tern and a 62 yard scoring play at 9:17.

Panthers retaliated with a 74 yard 8 play march over nearly five minutes with senior fullback Harry Mitchell bulling the final five 1745 for another season yards and giving Va. Union a 20-12 lead to take to the dressing room.

The Panthers, who were to score in each quarter, added a third period score on a 29 yard run by Brian Smith. They upped their count to 33-12 at the 11:12 mark of the final stanza when wide-receiver Carl Bland deftly returned a Tony Frasier 56 yards

Fraylon directed to two scores over a five minute span. He hit Hunter on a 5 yard score at 7:36 and then ran in from the 1: at 3:18.

Central's onside kick was recovered by William Dillon and the Panthers ran out the final three minutes.
