The church celebrated it's Diamond Jubilee with more than 45,000 delegates in the headquarters city during the ten day conclave. Presiding Bishop J.O. Patterson, Sr., presided over the convention along with the General Board of Twelve.

A new general board member was elected in the general assembly of the church. Bishop Jacob Cohen of Miami, Florida was re-elected to the general board to complete the unexpired term of Bishop O.M. Kelly who recently died in New York City.

The late Bishop Kelly left vacant two other positions and they were filled as follows: Bishop Frederick Douglass Washington Brooklyn, New York,



Bishopric of Eastern New York. Bishop Washington will preside over all of the Churches of God in Christ in the eastern territory of New York State which has approximately 150 congregations. Washington Bishop Kelly as assistant prelate for many years and the church felt that his faithfulness in service and dilligence in ministry qualified him for service as senior pastor of the churches in New York.

The final vacancy left by the death of Bishop Kelly was that of the assistant Bishopric of the international church. Bishop Kelly served as First Presiding Assistant Bishop, First Vice President and First Vice Chairman of the General Board. In the recent general assembly session, the church ratified the appointment of Bishop Louis Henry Ford, of Chicago, Illinios, for the office. Bishop Junious Augustus Black of San Diego, was ratified as se-Bishop, second vice president and second vice chairman of the General Board of the denomination.

In another suprise move, Presiding Bishop Patterson elevated a young man from Layfayette, Louisiana to


the Bishopric. Dr. Roy Lawrence Hailey Win-bush of the western jurisdiction of Louisiana was elevated to the rank of Auxiliary Bishop to assist Bishop John Walter White who is prelate of the jurisdic-tion. The installation and consecration of the new Bishops will take place in January of 1983 in their cities of residence.



The All Saints at of the "University (A.S.U.) will Presiding -- be located in Memphis, on Tennessee on the 26 acres of downtown properties presently owned by the church. The ad-ministration building, dorms and first classrooms will be ready for use in late-summer 1984. Construction is actively planning cur-riculum and facility for the target date.
