state that has very measurable goals and time frames," he said. "I have recommended to our Board (OBT) that we set up a programmatic audit whereby we would be apprised of any deadline, that has passed between meetings or that is upcoming. This way, the Board is able to monitor the agency's activities very closely."

"The last, and perhaps most striking effect, is that the new law robs CAA's of their advocacy role, places restrictions on the spending of administrative funds, Board membership and political activities."

Dr. Robinson explains that, "What this new approach has in fact done is to make us no longer a political animal. We cannot assist the poor in gaining access to or establishing linkages into the city's resources as we have traditionally done. The trend today is away from making fundamental structural changes and is aimed more toward changing the constituent himself."

The transition from federal to state control was rocky at best. Neither state officials nor CAA heads seemed to expect and were forced to pretty much play it by

ear. The Community Service Agency (CSA), a former federal granting source, was dismantled in September, 1981, and it took several months for the new state bureaucracy to take shape.

The Breakthrough proposal was submitted in October of 1981, approved to begin on January 1, but no actual operating funds were received until February, at which time the office was functioning with only fifty per cent of its staff.

These difficulties, though anticipated, resulted in a time lapse for the agency's 98 member crew.

McNeil reflects positively on this period. "It meant in a sense that we had a new beginning," he said, "the rules of the game had changed as administrators and clients are all too aware. So we embarked on this new course which will continue to serve the interests of the total low-income community of Durham."

Wachovia Announces Cash Management Account

Wachovia Bank and Trust Company has announced its new money market account, called the Wachovia Cash Investment Account, which will pay money market rates.

The account will be available December 14 to individuals, businesses and non-profit organizations. Approval for this type of account was issued last week by the Depository Institutions Deregulation Committee in Washington.

"With the Cash Investment Account Wachovia can now be fully competitive with the money market funds which have drained money from local communities and financial institutions," said John G. Medlin, Jr., president of Wachovia. "In addition to money market rates the account offers the advantages of FDIC insurance and immediate access to funds."

A minimum initial deposit of \$2,500 is required. Money market rates will be paid on the account if the average daily balance for the month is \$2,500 or higher. If the average is below \$2,500 the interest rate will be 5 1/4 per cent.

There is no ceiling on the rate which Wachovia can pay. The rate is subject to change daily to reflect money market conditions.

Customers can make an unlimited number of withdrawals from the account through Wachovia's 110 Teller II automated teller machines or by going in to any of Wachovia's 198 branches across North Carolina. In addition, up to three checks are allowed each month.

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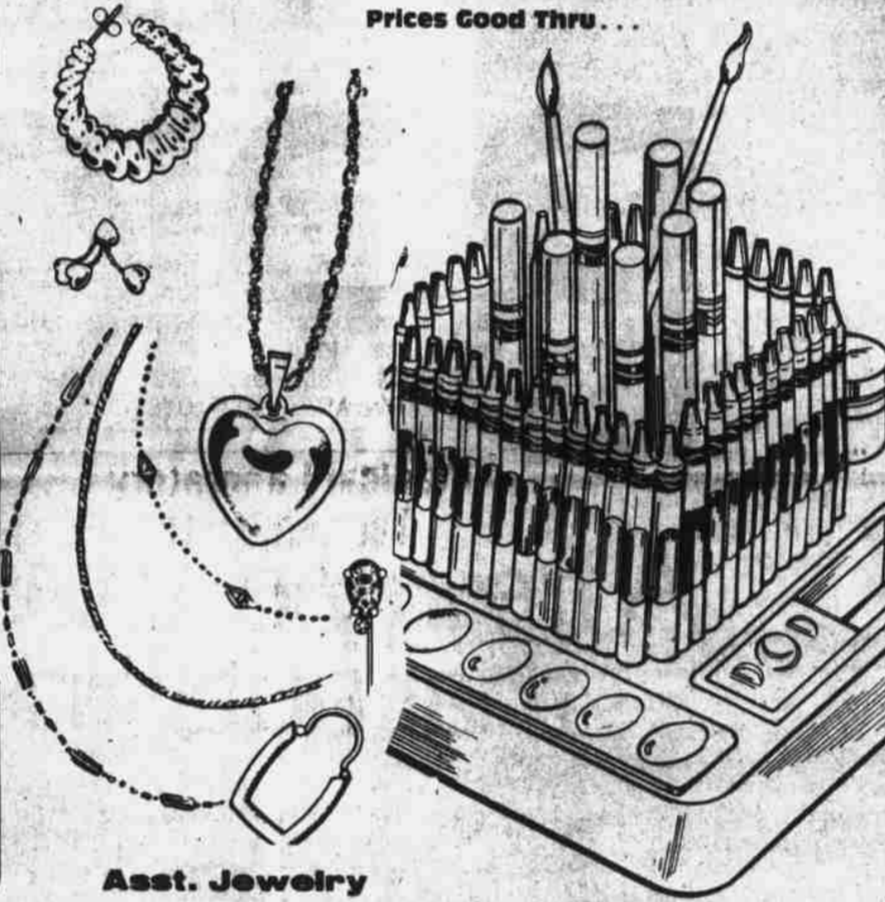

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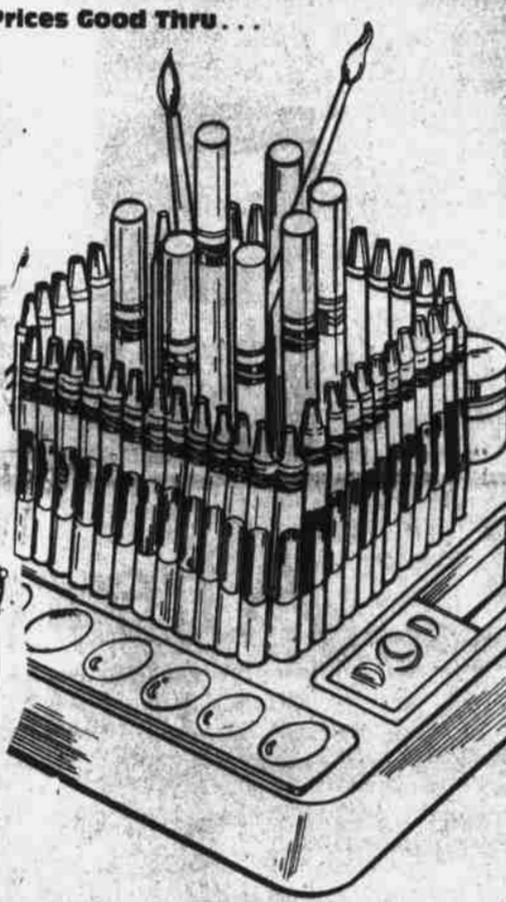
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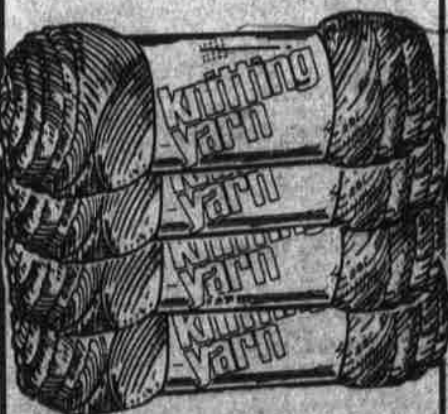


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
