CFA Lawyer Day A Success—Plan Mail Order

The Durham Call For Action office experienced a successful "Ask the Lawyer Day" November 17, with 87 answered calls and 480 busy signals. Four experts manning the telephones were from the 14th District Judicial Bar and one from North Central Legal Assistance Program.

The majority of persons seeking information were between the ages of 20 and 39. Sixty-one women and 26 men called. Most caller's incomes ranged from \$8,000 to \$24,999. Forty-six callers had used a lawyer previously and 41 had never used one. Calls were received from ten different counties.

Most of the persons calling wanted information concerning domestic relations, probating a will, trust funds or estates, and real estate problems. Other areas

covered were: consumer, disability laws, employment, fee complaints for lawyers, insurance, lawyer's ethics, and medical malpractice.

The Call For Action volunteers who assisted were Mrs. Jochebed Locust, Mrs. Catherine Stanback, Miss Helen Morrison, Mrs. Virgie J. Davis and Miss Edna Mason.

Call For Action is planning another national project "Ask the Mail Order Expert", January 19-20, 1983. During that time, volunteers will take mail order complaints from persons who have ordered through the mail and have only received their cancelled checks back.

(Continued from Page 4) months ahead. Wearing a scarf or hat on your head when outdoors is one way to protect your hair. This keeps your body's warmth and moisture close to your hair.

"Cold, dry weather tends to dry out your hair just as it dries out your skin and it can make your hair very, very brittle," she says. "Covering your hair does not give complete protection, but at least you're keeping your body's warmth and moisture close to your hair to a certain extent."

Switching from a shampoo for oily hair to a gentler shampoo for normal or dry hair in the winter and using an intense conditioner twice a month will also help keep your hair in its best possible condition.

William Friday, chairman of the Commission on the Future of North Carolina, will conduct the opening session on Monday.

Gov. James B. Hunt, Jr., will give the keynote address.

"This conference marks the culmination of 18 months of discussion and study by citizens all across our state to

develop policies and strategies to better prepare us for the year 2000."

In June 1981, Gov. Hunt and leaders from business, government, and the professions joined with other citizens of North Carolina in undertaking the ambitious NC 2000 project.

"Tens of thousands of

people have taken part," said Friday. "They have attended county meetings, completed

questionnaires and prepared technical papers. But most important, they have contributed ideas on what they want to see happen in North Carolina's future and why."

According to Friday, the conference has three goals. They are:

*To give citizens an

opportunity to review the Commission's draft goals and recommendations.

*To recognize the contribution of county NC 2000 committees, technical experts, civic and professional organizations and others.

*To offer a forum for further discussion of the problems and opportunities facing North Carolinians in the future.
