Tobacco Prospects In Growers' Favor

Lumberton, June 3—Ample rainfall and good growing weather in the last two weeks have pushed the tobacco crop in the Lumberton area ahead of normal schedule, according to Jasper C. Hutto, supervisor of the Lumberton tobacco auction market. The supervisor's statement is made in connection with issuance of his fifth tobacco crop condition report for the season.

Field reports and personal investigation throughout the area reveal, the supervisor said, unusually favorable conditions for the growers. Grasshoppers, wire worms and bud worms are doing some damage, with only light and scattering hailstorms reported.

The report on the 16 counties in the Lumberton area is as follows: Reports from all sections of the Lumberton tobacco area indicate sufficient rains have fallen, with good growing weather and the customary reasonable tobacco plant insects. There has been comparatively little hail damage reported. Prospects at this period are rated as good to excellent. All planting has been completed.

Fields in the northern and eastern sections of the area are reported in some instances as having plants with as many as 20 leaves. To the north and west plants have from six to 12 leaves. All sections report plants as making good progress, with particular improvement to the south and east, where dry weather two weeks ago offered a threat to the crop.

Grasshoppers appear to be more in evidence than usual, with bud worms and wire worms supplying about the customary annoyance. Apparently the entire area has had less replanting this season than normally. Severe hail damage in the territory up to the middle of the week was along the North-South Carolina state line, in Columbus county.

Prospects as a whole continue strongly in the growers' favor.

H. R. PARTIN, ADMINISTRATOR OF C. H. PARTIN, SEEKS \$10,000 FROM BUIK'S CREEK SCHOOL AND ITS DRIVER

H. R. Partin, administrator of the estate of C. H. Partin who was fatally injured in Angier on March 7th when he was struck by a bus owned by Campbell College, has instituted suit for \$10,000 against the Buik's Creek school and its agent, A. S. Lamm, driver of the truck at the time of the accident.

Partin, 66 years old, succumbed in a Raleigh hospital six weeks after the crash.

It is charged in the complaint, filed with Clerk of Court Howard Godwin by Henry C. Strickland and Franklin T. Dupree of Angier, that Partin's injuries resulted from negligence on the part of Lamm, a ministerial student in the school and driver of the bus which Campbell College maintains for use of its athletic teams and various organizations.

Lamm's bus was traveling southward on the part of highway 55 in Angier, known as Raleigh street, about 7:30 in the evening of March 7th, Saturday. Plaintiff contends that Lamm was too occupied with looking to his right and left and did not pay due attention to the road in front of him. Partin claims the truck traveled 85 feet before Lamm brought it to a standstill.

Clerk Godwin has granted Partin permission to bring the suit as a

New Government Regulations Concerning Charge Accounts Are Now In Effect

On purchases made after May, the regulation will work as follows: June purchases, due July 10, payable before August 10. July purchases, due August 10, payable before September 10. The Government has ordered that when it is impossible to comply with this ruling, the merchant and the customer may work out an arrangement to take care of the unpaid balance. Otherwise, the merchant is not permitted to charge anything to you, until the old balance is paid.
