HELP THE WAR Y. M. C.

A WAR WORK FUND!

The Nation is Asked to Raise \$35,000,000 for this fund in the immediate future. Hertford County is a part of the Nation. Will we do our duty? Let's answer it by oversubscription!

A nation-wide campaign is being conducted this week in behalf of the War Y. M. C. A. Work. Due to the late notice of the part Hertford County is expected to play in this campaign, a gasoline campaign in the County, and poor phone service, which prevented a hasty organization, the active campaign for this County will be waged next week, beginning Sunday night at Winton.

We are quite anxious that the people become informed as to the nature and scope of this War Y. M. C. A. work. There seems to be no general knowledge as to what it really is, a good many having the idea that the campaign is only in the interest of local Y. M. C. A. work. It is the work being done for our own enlisted men; both at home and abroad, from a moral, physical and mental standpoint; and from the standpoint, for the men of our Allies under arms, inasmuch as possible. The work is of most vital importance and herewith are given the estimates of President Wilson and other noted men of the nation:

Your President says: "The spirit of our forces and the efficiency in battle will be vitally affected by the environment surrounding our training camps." Secretary Daniels says: "From every standpoint, military, political, and moral; it is our duty to protect these youths so we can say to the mothers when the war is over 'we return your sons as worthy of your family circle as when they left.'" General Pershing, in command of our boys in France, says: "The work now being done by the Y. M. C. A. for the comfort and entertainment of our soldiers in France is very important. As an organization, its moral influence is highly beneficial. It performs a real service that makes for contentment."

As Chairman of the campaign work for Hertford County, I make an appeal to every man and woman to do their patriotic duty in behalf of the movement. Give American fighting men on land and sea every chance for their lives. The more efficient the Army and Navy the quicker victory will come to us and the fewer lives will be lost. The United War Service and Y. M. C. A. are working to keep Americans inspired in their task. It is done at the request of the secretaries of the Navy and Army. Shall the citizens of Hertford County be termed slackers? It is left for them to say. The county is asked to contribute \$1500 to this cause. Surely a population of 16,000 people, who have subscribed less than \$50,000 for Liberty Loan Bonds, will go far beyond this apportionment.

The campaign will be conducted very largely through township rallies, which will be held for both white and colored races, at 7:30 o'clock on night, and at the places according to the schedule published below.
