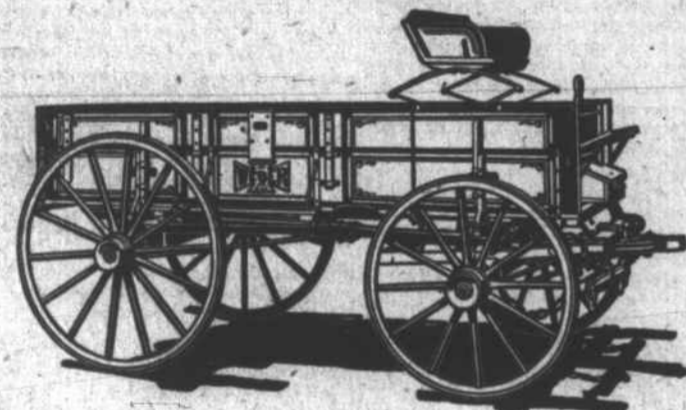

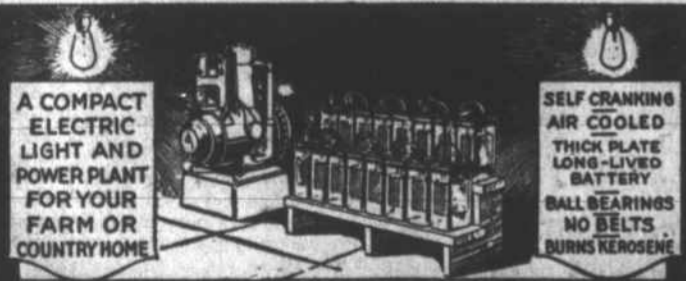

(Continued from page one) be sucking her blood, is dipped in the solution prepared by the Government inspector, the ticks are all killed and the cow showed decided improvement in flesh and became thrifty in appearance, I am satisfied that if we would all dip our cattle which are out in the woods regularly for one season we would free our county of ticks and the cattle quarantine would be raised. Mr. James Harper, Jackson, N. C. Dear sir:

I wish to express myself in regard to the dipping vat. I was opposed to it at first but soon found out that I was wrong. It is a great benefit to my community, for cattle that use to be poor and ticky are now fat and sleek as can be, and selling for three times what they were a few years back. As to my milk cow, I must say that the increase in milk is at least 33 1-3 per cent more and butter is 25 per cent more and 50 per cent better for table use. Dear sir:

Pleased to acknowledge your letter of October 4th making inquiry regarding benefit received from use of dipping vats on our farms. It is very hard for us to say just how much benefit our stock gets from dipping. Careful attention prompts us to say that we are getting more than \$5 per head benefit per year out of our stock where we have dipping vats; in other words, our cattle that have been dipped properly are worth \$10 per head more at two years old than the cattle on our farms that have not been dipped; and we believe that it takes at least ten per cent less feed for the cattle that are properly dipped.
