NEWS FROM THE STATE CAPITOL

Raleigh, April 9.—Everybody is busy here boosting Liberty Bonds, most of them in the big parade and at the big city auditorium, with Secretary of Treasury, McAdoo, the principal attraction. There has never been so much enthusiasm on the subject of war bonds, and people were never more anxious to do all that is possible to help win the war, as at present.

Most of the business places were closed during the parade and speaking, and all the business people and their employees participated in the day, with the "war anniversary" words of President Wilson, of war to the finish, still ringing in their ears and inspiring their efforts. All over North Carolina and throughout the United States, it is believed, a similar degree of en-

thusiasm and patriotism and the three billion of bonds will be taken as planned.

Considerable interest is manifested here and among public men who visit Raleigh in the news that Judge Frank Carter has bought the Albemarle Enterprise and is to get right into the thick of the "fourth estate" in North Carolina—and they fully expect the judge will add right much to the "gaiety of nations", not to mention Tar Heel politics and politicians.

One of the interesting contests of the year is that for the Superior Court judgeship of this, the seventh judicial district, for which there are now four candidates in the field. The district is composed of only two counties and Wake furnishes three of the candidates (Galvert, the incumbent; W. B. Snow and W. C. Harris) while Franklin presents Senator Wiley Person. It is probable that Snow will win, largely because Judge Galvert does not know anything about politics.
