

Meeting of County Commissioners

The Board of County Commissioners of Hertford County met at courthouse in Winton, on January 2nd, 1922, present, J. C. Taylor, E. W. Whitley, E. H. Eure, J. M. Eley, J. O. Askew, Jr., and F. G. Tayloe.

Proceedings of the last meeting were read and approved.

The County Attorney was added to the committee to ascertain, if any, amount of back taxes due the County from the Carter estate.

Committee to build flats and floats for Parker ferry continued.

The Clerk is given instructions to file up with the State Highway Commission the matter of difference due by them to the county.

F. G. Tayloe is continued as committee to move houses at the County Home.

The committee on the waterworks at the jail is continued.

E. H. Eure as committee to check report made by the Clerk of Court is continued.

J. C. Taylor is continued as committee to investigate repairs to the courthouse at Como.

The matter of increase of bond of Bank of Winton, Treasurer, is continued until the next meeting of the Board.

On motion and carried, the Board votes to rescind its action taken at a previous meeting appropriating the sum of \$1,000 toward employing a whole-time health officer for the county, and now declines to cooperate.

The clerk is instructed to request the committee, appointed to investigate the killing of sheep of W. L. Mitchell, to return their report sent back to them, and if the original report cannot be located, to endeavor to duplicate same.

The committee appointed to reassess the property of W. E. Jenkins, in Murfreesboro reported to the Board that an error was made in the valuation, and submitted as their report a corrected assessment, to-wit: "That at the valuation on said property read on 82.22 acres cleared land at \$75.00 per acre, value \$6166 and 11.21 acres woods land at \$20.00 per acre, value \$224, making aggregate sum of \$6390.00. This valuation for the purpose of taxation for year 1920. The Board unanimously adopted the valuation for year 1920, the change being made on account of an error in committee returning more acreage than was really in the plat of land. The Board also orders that the valuation on the above property shall be less 33 and 1-3 for year 1921."

J. C. Taylor made report on the site of courthouse at Como and presented deed for same, and he was discharged from the committee.

The Board, upon motion and carried, appointed E. W. Whitley committee to have boat built for Hill's ferry at once.

Upon motion and carried, it was ordered that the Board pay no more for sheep killed by dogs, than the said sheep are listed for taxation the previous year.

It coming to the attention of the Board that W. J. Earley has been paid for 11 head of sheep killed and now makes claim for three more killed, making a total of 14 heads and it further finds that no sheep were listed to him for the year 1921; the Board orders the Clerk to instruct Mr. Earley to appear before the Board and show cause why he should not be double taxed for these sheep.

The Board instructs Mr. Eure to investigate and ascertain if arrangements can be made to provide the Home Demonstrator with an office in the courthouse building and if so to proceed to have the work done.

Clerk of Court presented receipt from the Bonding Company showing annual premium paid on his bond as clerk.

On motion and carried the Board orders that Henry Hurdle be cited to appear before the Board at its next meeting and show cause, if any, why he should not reimburse the county for \$17.50 paid to R. A. Holloman for sheep killed by his dogs.

The Board votes to appoint committee consisting of E. H. Eure and J. D. Beale to investigate the listing of tract of land (Overton) in Winton township, belonging to Norman Hall and ascertain if claim made by Hall for destroyed buildings is correct.

The tax collector for St. Johns Township is authorized to make correction in Mrs. J. M. Forbes tax list and return as error and also to make refund to the amount of six dollars to E. T. and C. B. Vaughan error in Menola school district taxes.

The Board gives the Clerk instructions to investigate the bills of Walker Evans and Cogswell Co. and to pay such amount as is agreed upon to be correct.

The Board unanimously agrees that interest on all daily balances according to the Road funds in the hands of Treasurer, shall be credited to the said road fund.

The County Demonstrator is authorized and instructed to aid the work of hog demonstration at the Co. Home.
