The committee appointed to reas-sess the property of W. E. Jenkins, in Murfreesbore reported to the Board that an error was made in the valuation, and submitted as their report a corrected assessment, to-wit: "That the valuation on said property read on 82.22 acres cleared land at \$75.00 per acre, value \$6166 and 11.21 acres woods land at \$20.00 per acre, value \$224, making aggregate sum of \$6390.00. This valuation for the pupose of taxation for year 1920. The Board unanimously adpoted the valuation for year 1920, the change being made on account of an error in committee returning more acreage than was really in the plat of land. 




