

**MEETING OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS**

The Board of County Commissioners of Hertford county met on the 6th day of March, 1922. Present, J. C. Taylor, E. W. Whitely, E. H. Eure, J. M. Eley, J. O. Askew, Jr., and F. G. Tayloe.

Proceedings of the last meeting were read and approved.

E. G. Taylor as committee to have house at County Home moved is continued. J. C. Taylor as committee to make repairs necessary to Court House in Maney's Neck is continued. E. H. Eure as committee to have office fixed for Home Demonstration Agent, is continued. E. W. Whitely as committee to have heat built for Home Demonstration Agent, is continued.

The Bank of Winton, Treasurer, is granted until next meeting of the Board to have additional bond completed.

The Board, upon motion and carried, instructs and authorizes J. O. Askew, Jr., to have timber cut from County Home property and to make arrangements to build flat for Pitch Landing ferry.

The Board orders the Clerk to put notice in the Hertford County Herald stating that all taxes will be required to be paid in by the first Monday in April and all Tax Collectors will be required to settle by the first Monday in May as the law directs.

On motion and carried, the matter of back taxes against the estate of J. C. Carter is deferred again until first Monday in April.

The Board authorizes that license be granted to H. C. Britt as County necessary bond.

The question of colored demonstration came up again before the Board upon a petition of the colored matter, upon motion of E. H. Eure seconded by F. G. Tayloe, the Board voted to rescind its former action discontinuing colored farm demonstration work. Voting in the negative Jno. C. Taylor, and J. C. Askew, Jr.

Upon motion and carried, the board votes to appropriate the sum of \$10,000 per month beginning Mar. 1st, 1922, to co-operate in this colored demonstration work. Voting in the negative, J. C. Taylor and J. O. Askew, Jr.

On motion and carried, C. N. Britton is refunded \$18.00 Menola school district taxes account error in listing.

The Board, upon motion and carried

ried voted unanimously that the Tax Collectors be paid commission of 3.38 per cent. on the 1921 taxes. The Board orders that the sum of \$46.08 be refunded to G. L. Vann account of an error in listing his property in Winton School district year 1920.

The Board voted to make the amount \$3.00 per head for sheep killed belonging to W. L. Mitchell instead of \$5.00 head as that appears to be the amount on tax list for 1921.

Mr. E. H. Eure is instructed to investigate complaint of Fred. Hare for an error in listing tract of land in Winton township.

The Board authorizes Clerk to issue check for payment of work on the Home Demonstration Agency when completed, same to be approved by E. H. Eure and to be reported to the Board at next meeting.
