Whereas: The County Board of Education presented to the Board of County Commissioners a resolution passed by said Board of Education on this date requesting that this Board issue bonds in the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars for and on behalf of Special Tax School District No. 1., in St. Johns Township, Hertford County, substantially in the form as set out in said resolution filed with this Board, for the purpose af erecting school buildings in said district; and

Whereas: It was requested by said Board of Education that a proper tax levy be made for the payment of both principal and interest on said bonds

as they shall become due.

Now therefore: Be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Hertford County, North Carolina, that the resolution passed by said Board of Education be incorporated in the minutes of this Board and ratified by this Board; and be it

Further Resolved: That the Board of County Commissioners of Hertford County issue bonds for said School District in substantially the form set set out in said resolution and upon the execution thereof, that the same be delivered to said County Board of Education to be sold as the law

Further resolved: That at the time for the levying of state and county taxes by this Board that a special tax be levied on the property and polls in said district such as may be sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as the same become due and the principal thereof at maturity; said tax not to exceed thirty cents on the hundred dollars valuation of property and ninety cents on the poll.
