TOBACCO CONTINUES TO POUR ON LOCAL MARKET

Only Few More Sales Necessary To Bring Total To The Million Pound Mark

If tobacco continues to fill the auction warehouses of Ahoskie as it has during the last three weeks this will be perhaps the largest season during the life of the market. Both houses are running heavy sales every day and total sales are showing an increase each week.

The half a million pound mark was passed last week, and with the large amount that has been sold here this week only a few more sales will be needed to bring it up to the million pound mark. On Tuesday of this week approximately 125,000 pounds were sold at the two warehouses. The Co-Operative Association warehouse is taking care of the tobacco belonging to its members.

Prices have continued to advance as the better grades are marketed. Farmers seem to be well satisfied with their sales; and, although the crop is light, a normal return is expected from the 1922 tobacco.
