The Board of County Commissioners of Hertford County met on the 6th day of November, 1922. Present: J. M. Eley, Chairman, J. C. Taylor, E. W. Whitley, E. H. Eure, J. O. Askew, Jr., and F. G. Tayloe. Proceedings of last meeting read and approved.

The following committees were continued, to-wit:

Committee to repair Court House in Maneys Neck Township. Committee on error in listing town lot in Ahoskie to Mrs. Hyatt. The matter of amount due the county by the State Highway Commission is continued.

Committee to build boat for Hills Ferry. Committee to secure stair strip for Court house. Committee to purchase electric motor for pump.

Committee to underpin water closet. W. T. Pace having appeared and made satisfactory explanation as to waterworks; the same was accepted by the Board.

The Clerk of the Board is instructed to write Wilson and Co., Suffolk to ascertain when they expect to start installation of the heating plant
