TOMMIE KIFF SICK

A telegram was received here Monday by the parents of Tommie Kiff, a member of the United States Navy, stating that he was seriously ill with bronchial pneumonia. The message came from Long Beach, California. Tommie being a member of the crew of the Hospital Ship, Mercy. A later message received Tuesday stated he was improving, and was receiving careful attention. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. A. O. Kiff of Route 5.

CUTS BOY'S FINGER

Little Jennings Myers, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. J. Myers, had one of his fingers severed just above the knuckle last Friday. He and his cousin, Joe Copeland, 6 years old, were playing together and an axe was one of their articles of amusement. Young Copeland accidentally slashed the finger of his little comrade and severely cut another. A small tissue kept the finger from being amputated. Medical attention was given and the finger is improving.

INCREASE IN INFLUENZA THROUGH THIS SECTION

For the last three weeks many cases of influenza have been reported in Ahoskie and vicinity. In several homes within the town, every member of the family has had attacks, and were confined to their beds at the same time. Several persons have suffered with aggravated cases that have kept them in bed for two weeks or more. Among the number are several school children.

Although not large in volume, there have also been several cases of pneumonia reported. Among those who are now suffering with pneumonia are John Gatling, and Earl Powell, young son of Mrs. Ruth Powell.

CAR OF BRICK BURNS

An early morning fire yesterday completely destroyed three freight cars loaded with brick, cotton and lumber. The cars were part of a siding just north of the water tank near the edge of town. The origin of the fire is unknown. The loss would have been much greater had not a passing freight train been held up by the fire, and which engine was used to remove the other cars from the scene. As the fire was beyond town and had gained considerable headway when discovered, no efforts were made to extinguish the flames, and it was permitted to burn itself out.

Freight traffic was delayed several hours and the early morning passenger train was delayed about thirty minutes.

LUCIUS BRITTON DIES

Mr. Lucius Britton, 37 years old, died of pneumonia at his home near St. Johns, last Saturday night at 10 o'clock. He had been sick for only a few days, an attack of influenza developing into pneumonia causing his death.

Funeral was held Sunday afternoon and burial was made in the family cemetery at his home. At the time of his burial his aged father was also very sick and his death was expected. However, he has since improved.

He was married and is survived by his wife and five young children, the oldest of them being 6 years of age. Besides his immediate family, his aged mother and father, Mr. and Mrs. Burke Britton, survive. He also has three brothers and two sisters living in the Menola section of the county.
