Sec. 11. DUTIES OF SHERIFFS Hertford and Northampton. AND OTHER PEACE OFFICERS. All sheriffs, deputy sheriffs, police officers and constables are hereby made ex-officio Deputy Game Wardens, and it shall be their duty to aid in the enforcement of this law, but shall serve without compensation except as herein provided.
