Four years ago the total vote of the State on the Congressional tickets was 250,882—democratic 141,894, republican 118,987. This year the total appears to be 280,327, an increase of 19,445.

The Elizabeth City Beacon calls for a meeting of the presidents of the Democratic clubs of Bladen county for the purpose of forming a permanent county club. This is a move in the right direction. The Democrats should keep up their organizations.

The inauguration of Judge Fowle as Governor of North Carolina will probably take place about January 20th. The arrangements for it, according to the law, must be made by the legislature. The legislature meets on the first Wednesday after the first Monday in January, which falls on January 9th.

The stockholders of the High Point, Randleman, Asheboro and Southern Railroad Company met at High Point Dec. 6th, and completed the organization of said company. The following gentlemen were elected Directors: W. H. Snow, Elwood Cox, W. O. Harris, J. H. Ferree, J. E. Walker, T. C. Worth, A. C. McAllister, W. P. Wood and G. S. Bradshaw.

At a meeting of the Directors Mr. Elwood Cox was elected President to fill the vacancy occasioned by the death of Mr. Robert P. Dicks; Mr. S. G. Newlin, Secretary and J. H. Mills, Treasurer. An executive committee consisting of Elwood Cox, W. O. Harris and G. S. Bradshaw was appointed to whom the Board of Directors delegated such power as is necessary to consummate the plans of the company. Col. Andrews was present as the representative of the Richmond and Danville Railroad Company. The COURIER is pleased to know that all the arrangements are practically completed and the Road is assured beyond any reasonable doubt. The surveyors are now on the line completing their work and a large force will be put to work as early after the Holidays as is possible to perfect the necessary arrangements.
