Instead of crowding his customers to pay, he accepts their notes for sixty or ninety days, takes these to the bank and guarantees their payment when due by endorsing them (writing his name across the back) and asks the bank to lend him the money that he needs for the purchase of the new goods. The bank having the money that depositors have left for safe keeping until they need it lends the merchant the money he requires charging him interest for its use. The farmer is helped by the bank in the same way. In the spring he may need money to buy seeds or farming implements so he goes to the bank with his notes as security and gets the money needed for carrying on his business of farming.
