



NEW STYLE GRAFTING.

At the recent meeting of the American Pomological society the following method of grafting was described by a gentleman from Colorado, who stated that it was the most successful method that he had employed in top working old orchards and that it could be used on branches as large as four inches in diameter with great success. It impressed me as being for better than ordinary cleft grafting, especially for

ordinary cleft graft. This method of grafting is undoubtedly well adapted to take the place of cleft grafting for all stocks over three-quarters of an inch in diameter. If you try it you will be surprised at the firmness with which the selon will stick in the stock. which the scion will stick in the stock. 
