General William T. Sherman—who is much more practical than his brother John—says that for \$25,000,000 to be expended an harbor fortifications for New York he will engage to put the city in a position to defy the iron-clads that to-day can lay that city in ashes in two hours.

But this is another trick to reduce the surplus in the treasury without reducing taxation. Let us have some tax reduction first.

The Knoxville Journal says: "The fact is, as every one knows who has kept up with the political history of the country for these three years, the democratic leaders in Congress have utterly refused to do anything towards a reduction of the surplus revenue unless they could do it in their own way and in accordance with their own pet theories."

What have the republicans in Congress done to reduce the surplus in the past three years, save introduce measures for spending it outrageously and extravagantly? Did they not, as a body, vote both against reducing taxation or even allowing a bill introduced by a large majority of the democrats for a reduction of taxation to be considered by the House? A large majority of the democrats of the House have made several efforts to reduce the surplus by reducing taxation; the republicans, as a body, have not only prevented this reduction, but have shown repeatedly that their only "pet theory" of reduction is to keep up high taxation, and keep the surplus down by distributing it around in jobs, mostly to republicans and northern localities at that.

The fact is, every one who has kept up with the political history of the country for the past three years" understand very fully the difference between the "pet theories" of the two parties, and a large majority of the tax payers of the country endorse the theory of the democrats which provides for a reduction of taxation.

THE GRAND ARMY, AND MESSRS. CLEVELAND, SHERMAN AND BLAINE.

The Knoxville Journal, republican, is endeavoring to make excuses for the conduct of the Fairchilds and Tuttle of the Grand Army, for their insults to the commander-in-chief of the armies of the union. The Journal adds:

"There are reasons why the Grand Army boys should not gush over Mr. Cleveland, as has been before remarked in the columns of the Journal. When they were exposing themselves to the hardships incident to army life, and the bullets of the enemy, although an able-bodied man of proper age, he was skulking in the rear. If he had done something for his country when his country needed help, and taken the risks that others took, then these veterans would have a kinder feeling for him. As it is, they see no occasion to gush over him."

If Mr. Cleveland obnoxious to the above, then what will the Journal say as to either Blaine or Sherman. What did either do by way of "exposing himself to the hardships incident to army life?" To show the real animos of the Journal, however, in another column of the same issue, it says:

"There is a general feeling of satisfaction, we think, among republicans throughout the country, at the action of the Ohio convention in endorsing John Sherman?"

THE FLOOD—A SUGGESTION.

While the recent hot wave prevailed over the country east of the Rocky Mountains, the floods which have followed seem to have been quite as general, and more destructive. From every section we hear of heavily, even unusually swollen streams, and the damage to crops and other interests have been very severe. Our Georgia friends have suffered very greatly, and we fear our South Carolina and Eastern North Carolina people have likewise suffered. The streams throughout Western Carolina have been heavily swollen, if not destructively so, though, aside from some washouts at a few places on the Western Carolina and Sparta roads, we have not yet heard of serious complaints. It is rumored that the Murphy and Sparta roads have suffered quite heavily by washouts, but we hope to learn before going to press that they are not so heavy as thought to be at this writing. Aside from the destruction of crops

in the South and the low country, the overflow must produce a poisonous atmosphere which may result very seriously. It might be an act of humanity for our people throughout Western Carolina to have our friends in these threatened localities to understand they can get board at reasonable rates, at least during the remainder of the warm season. Rates should be reduced for these people. In their prosperity they contribute very largely to the prosperity of our section, and a consideration of them in their misfortunes, a loss of crops and threatened pestilence would be a grateful acknowledgment of our obligations. We would be glad to know that our people take such steps as suggested.

Now for Pennsylvania! The Democracy of Pennsylvania is as much in favor of the policy of Cleveland's administration on the tariff as are their brethren in Ohio and other portions of the country. In order that the true sentiments of the Democrats may be expressed care should be taken in the selection of delegates to the next State Convention. —The Record Dem.

WITH OLD-TIME VIGOR. Quoth the New York Herald: "All three conventions—the Rhode Island, the Louisville and the Cleveland—have heartily and generously endorsed the President. This is rather an appalling fact for the Republicans to ruminant upon, for they have fondly hoped to be blown to Washington by a cyclone in the Democratic party. So far as they are concerned it is a pity that the Democrats are beginning to unite, but for the country the outlook is auspicious. With undivided ranks, with a policy of mutual concession on the blazing revenue question, with the land question well at the front, the Democrats can go into the campaign next year with their old-time vigor and come out of it with old-time victory."

Kind of Friends Henry Clay Drew to Him.

Perhaps no man in public life in the United States ever had so strong a personal following as Henry Clay. His friends were everywhere, and they were so numerous that he himself never knew them half by name. When the "Millions of the Slaves" was the candidate of the Whigs for the Presidency it became known that he had overdrawn his bank account at the Maysville bank for a considerable sum. One day three gentlemen, strangers to President Scott, of that institution, called at the bank and asked Mr. Scott how much Clay had overdrawn. He replied tersely that was none of their business, and that his bank was not in the habit of telling strangers the private affairs of its customers. The visitors said that they had come to make the account good and that they had asked the question that they might know how much would be required of them. That placed a different phase on the situation, and Mr. Scott told them that Mr. Clay's account was overdrawn to an amount approximating \$30,000. The visitors opened their saddlebags and immediately paid over the amount. Mr. Scott tried to find out who they were, but was unsuccessful, and up to the day of his death he never knew who were the benefactors of his customer. Mr. Scott's son, now a resident of Bloomington, Ill., would be interested to know who were the riders who carried \$30,000 in their saddlebags to save the name of Henry Clay, but no one has yet been able to enlighten him. —Indianapolis Journal.
