

FRUIT CROP.

We give below a circular letter from a Philadelphia firm in regard to the fruit trade this season. Prices will not be so large this season as last, but with the large crop that we will probably have, it will prove a great source of income to the country.

PEACHES.—Whether peaches are peeled or unpeeled, don't wait for the fruit to become perfectly ripe and mellow, because in this case, they will dry dark in color, and while a ripe peach is intrinsically better than a hard one yet the demand among the buyers is universally for bright colored peaches, whether pared or unpared.

ABOUT DRIED APPLES—Select good sound fruit—not ripe to mellowness. Pare them clean, take the cores entirely out, and cut in as fine slices as patience and labor will allow.

BLACKBERRIES—Have become a great staple. They should be thoroughly dried (not burned) before packed for market.

QUINCES AND PEARS—Nicely prepared by thorough paring, coring and drying, cut as fine as pared peaches ought to be, will bring fair prices.
