SAVING MANURE.

A correspondent from Griffin, Ga., asks us for advice as to the best method of saving manures. He refers, we suppose, to barn yard manure. We have a theory upon this subject which we believe to be a good one. We have never tried it experimentally, however; but we intend doing so, and our readers shall have the benefit of it.

We would turn all the old pines which are now allowed to rot upon our fields, into charcoal. To accomplish this, we would put the male force on the plantation to cutting and splitting wood, when the weather was unseasonable for other work.
