

## THE SUBMARINE TELEGRAPH.

The following letter has been received at the Navy Department from Captain Hudson, dated on board the United States steam frigate Niagara, Liverpool, July 24:

Sir: I have the honor to report that the 1,254 miles of telegraphic cable were all safely stowed away in this ship very soon after the appointed time, and that we are now waiting, as I had anticipated, the completion of the ponderous machinery which the engineer of the company has provided for running it out.

Several machinists are now employed on board setting it up, and I am happy to add, with some prospect of its being ready for experimental operations to morrow night.—The quarter deck looks more like a manufactory or machine shop than the quarter-deck of a ship-of-war. I sincerely hope that all may work well, and that we shall lay the wire out safely. Should the machinery be finished as contemplated, we shall leave this port on the 27th instant for the coast of Cork.

You will see from the annexed copy of a resolution of the board of directors that the starting point for laying down the cable is Valencia bay, (Ireland,) instead of a central position on the plateau; and I shall, for many cogent reasons, urge the claims of the ship to run out her portion of the cable first, and then accompany the Argonauts on her way to Trinity bay, (Newfoundland.)

GENERAL WALKER'S PLAN.—The St Louis News professes to give some inkling "an good authority," of what General Walker is doing and expects to do.

The money (\$250,000) is ready and subject to his draft at any moment. Walker does not desire more than one thousand men, as he is satisfied that with that number of men he can conquer and keep possession of Nicaragua in spite of all the Central American armies that can be brought into the field against him.

He is operating quietly at present, and keeps his own council; but the departure of another expedition to Nicaragua some time the coming fall, well appointed, and with Walker at its head, is an event that may be seriously expected.

C., and has been committed to the common jail of the district, to await the requisition of the Governor of North Carolina.
