North Carolina Fisheries

State Ranked Eleventh in the United States in Value of Products. Through the special efforts of the Salisbury Merchants' Association a bill entitled, "An act to prevent fraud on merchants," was passed by the general assembly of North Carolina, recently adjourned.

The chief fishing grounds of the state were Albemarle, Pamlico, and Core sounds, and their tributary rivers. Among the important rivers were the Cape Fear, New, Roanoke, Charlotte, Newport, and Neuse.

Jack Johnson, the negro prize-fighter who won the victory at Reno Nev., last summer, owns an automobile, and, following the example of white owners of machines, has a habit of running the machine to the limit.

Representatives of the conductors, firemen and locomotive engineers on the Cincinnati, New Orleans and Texas Pacific railway, who have been striking because negro firemen are alleged to have been given preferred runs on the road, have reached a tentative basis of settlement with the railway through the national mediation board.

The Governor has offered \$200 reward for the murderers of E. R. Gibbs, of Pasquotank county. Gibbs mysteriously disappeared after a long search his body was found in the river bearing marks that indicated murder.
