Washington Letter WASHINGTON, April 1, 1911. The national Congress is again in session—the second extra session of the present administration.

Raleigh honored herself in great shape last week. On Saturday night her citizens wound up a campaign for a \$65,000 Y. M. C. A. building. The amount was over-subscribed by several thousand.

Supreme Court Justice James Aloysius O'Gorman, Democrat, of New York City, was elected United States Senator tonight by the Legislature after the most protracted struggle over this position ever held in the Empire State.

At the close of a day of almost continuous negotiations the insurgents capitulated and Justice O'Gorman was elected. A few minutes before the ballot was cast Justice O'Gorman's resignation from the bench was filed at the office of the Secretary of State, as a constitutional provision would have prohibited his election while holding the office of Justice of the Supreme Court.

Dr. Stanhope Sams, for some years literary editor of the Columbia (S. C.) State, has been made editor of the Tokyo Times, one of the leading English newspapers of Japan, and he and Mrs. Sams started last Thursday on their trip to Japan.

The breaking of an axle of a coal car wrecked a southbound freight train at China Grove Saturday night. Paul Ingram, colored, an employe of the Southern, was killed, several cars were wrecked and the track torn up for some distance.

WASHINGTON, April 1, 1911. The national Congress is again in session—the second extra session of the present administration.

There is again discussion of peace pact between Great Britain and the United States and between France and the United States. With reciprocity with Canada and peace agreements with Great Britain and France, there would be little reason for the continuous expensive naval preparation of the last decade.

It is expected that there will be no little presidential electioneering and maneuvering in Washington during the present extra session. It is significant that the Bryan influence has been considerably strengthened in both houses of Congress, both by elimination and addition since March 4th.

OPEN AIR SCHOOLS INCREASE RAPIDLY.

Over Sixty Established Since January, 1907. Since January 1st, 1907, sixty-five Open Air Schools for children afflicted with or predisposed to tuberculosis have been established in twenty-eight cities, according to an announcement made in a bulletin issued to-day by the National Association for the Study and Prevention of Tuberculosis.

The first Open Air School in the United States was established on January 1st, 1907, by the Board of Education of Providence, R. I., at the instance of Dr. Ellen A. Stone. The next school was established in May of the same year at Pittsburg, a third one at Boston in July, 1908, and the fourth at Bellevue Hospital in New York in December, 1908.

According to reports received by the National Association, the result of the open air class-work has been to restore most of the children to normal health and efficiency. One of these open air schools or classes should be established for each 25,000 population, especially in cities.

The National Forest Reservation Commission, created under the Weeks law, is ready to commence purchasing lands for the creation of national forests in the Appalachian and White mountains according to an announcement by the Department of Agriculture.

The land purchase will be restricted to the States whose Legislatures have consented to the acquisition of land by the government for preserving the navigability of streams.
